OBJECTIONS TO REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

Anwar Jeylani, through counsel, respectfully objects to Report and Recommendations. This Court reviews the Magistrate Judge's findings and conclusions de novo. 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(C).

## I. THE COURT SHOULD REJECT THE R&R'S RECOMMENDATION BECAUSE ICE HAS BEEN UNABLE TO DEPORT MR. JEYLANI.

In February 2025, approximately six months after an immigration judge ordered his removal to Somalia, Mr. Jeylani asked this Court to authorize his release from custody because there was not good reason to believe he could be removed in the reasonably foreseeable future. Dkt 1. Approximately four months later, on June 4, 2025, federal respondents produced a travel document, which they averred would permit them to remove Mr. Jeylani to Somalia. Magistrate Judge Tsuchida cited that document in recommending the Court deny Mr. Jelani's petition.

Despite the acquisition of a travel document, Mr. Jeylani remains in custody at the Northwest Detention Center. He continues to do anything in his power to facilitate his removal to Somalia, and the harrowing conditions at NWDC make those efforts

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more urgent. See generally "Conditions at the Northwest Detention Center," University of Washington Center for Human Rights (accessed June 23, 2025). Nonetheless, it appears that Federal Respondents are unable to remove Mr. Jeylani.

## II. CONCLUSION

Mr. Jeylani's continued detention provides no "good reason to believe" that Mr. Jeylani is substantially likely to be removed to Somalia in the reasonably foreseeable future. The Court, exercising *de novo* review, should order Mr. Jeylani's release on appropriate conditions.
