KAVEH KAMYAB'S STATUS  
REPORT

Six days ago, Israel began bombing Iran, including Mashhad International Airport in Tehran. *See* "Israel kills Iranian intel chiefs, strikes deep inside Iran, opens 'air corridor to Tehran,'" *The Times of Israel*, June 16, 2025. President Trump has called for Iran's "unconditional surrender" and has said he may join Israel's military action. *See* "Trump Calls for Iran's 'Unconditional Surrender' and Threatens Its Supreme Leader," *New York Times*, June 17, 2025. He has warned Iran's head of state, Ali Khamenei, that the U.S. may assassinate him. *Id.* These events appear certain to end any pending discussions about returning Mr. Kamyab to Iran.

This conflict, in addition to the reasons raised in Mr. Kamyab's previously filed petition and response, means that there is not good reason to believe he will be returned to Iran in the reasonably foreseeable future. The law therefore requires Mr. Kamyab's conditional release from immigration custody. *See Zadvydas v. Davis*, 533 U.S. 678 (2001).
