RESPONSE TO MOTION FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

On March 24, 2025, the Court received Petitioner's petition for a writ of habeas corpus ("Petition"). ECF No. 1. On April 14, 2025, the Court ordered Respondent to respond to the Petition. ECF No. 7. On May 23, 2025, in lieu of a response, Respondent filed a Motion for Order for Bond Hearing. ECF No. 18. That Motion requests that the Court (1) issue an order for Petitioner to appear before an immigration judge ("IJ") for a bond hearing and individualized bond determination pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1226(a) and the applicable regulations within twenty-one days, and (2) stay further briefing on the Petition until the IJ makes an individualized bond determination. Mot. for Order for Bond Hearing 1-4, ECF No. 18.

On May 28, 2025, the Court received a document from Petitioner that has been docketed as a Motion for Immediate Release. ECF No. 19. The document is directed to "DHS/ICE Office of Chief Counsel"—not the Court. Mot. for Imm. Release 1, ECF No. 18-1. Therein, Petitioner appears to challenge his refusal of admission pursuant to the Visa Waiver Program ("VWP"), 8 U.S.C. § 1187. *Id.* at 1-2; *see also* Bush Decl. ¶¶ 4-6, ECF No. 18-1.

As Respondent argued in its Motion for Order for Bond Hearing, the Court should stay further briefing in this case until the Court orders a bond hearing pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1226(a) and the applicable regulations and Petitioner receives an individualized bond determination. Mot. for Order for Bond Hearing 1-4. In alignment with that prior request, Respondent respectfully requests that briefing on the present motion similarly be stayed. Petitioner raised the same argument advanced in the present motion in the Petition. Pet. 6, ECF No. 1. And as Respondent noted in its Motion for Order for Bond hearing, Petitioner has also raised this claim in many of his other filings. Pet'r's Resp. to Ct. Order 1-2; Pet'r's 1st Br. 1-2, ECF No. 9; Pet'r's 2d Br. 1-2, ECF No. 11; Pet'r's 3d Br. 3, ECF No. 14; Pet'r's 4th Br. 3, ECF No. 15; Pet'r's 5th Br. 3, ECF No. 16; see Mot. for Order for Bond Hearing 3. Petitioner's receipt of an individualized bond determination through a hearing before an IJ would substantially alter analysis of Petitioner claims. See Mot. for Order for Bond Hearing 3. For that reason, further briefing in this case should be stayed until the Court orders—and Petitioner receives—that remedy.
