PETITIONER'S SECOND STATUS REPORT

Petitioner Segundo Roberto Guaman Veintimilla hereby notifies the Court that—on June 13, 2025 at around 4:59 p.m.—the federal Bureau of Prisons (“BOP”) transferred Petitioner from its custody at the Federal Correctional Institute in Berlin, New Hampshire (“FCI Berlin”) to the custody of Immigration and Customs Enforcement (“ICE”). Subsequently, ICE’s Boston Field Office released Petitioner at Burlington, Massachusetts at around 9:00 p.m. on the same day.

ICE did not place on Petitioner an ankle bracelet for the GPS monitoring on June 13, 2025. However, ICE did place such a bracelet on Petitioner today, on June 17, 2025 in Framingham, Massachusetts. Because the GPS monitoring was not part of the bond order from the Immigration Judge (“IJ”), Petitioner objects to the imposition of such a condition and reserves his right to seek relief in this case requiring ICE to comply with the IJ’s bond order, as the IJ’s bond order did not include such conditions. *See Orellana Juarez v. Moniz*, Civil Action No. 25-cv-11266-MJJ, 2025

U.S. Dist. LEXIS 110708, at *16 (D. Mass. June 11, 2025) (“For the foregoing reasons, the Petition for Writ of Habeas is GRANTED. Petitioner may not be subjected to conditions of release that are not consistent with the terms as set by the Immigration Judge after the bond hearing. Petitioner is to be released from 24/7 GPS tracking and from ISAP immediately. Additionally, if Mr. Orellana Juarez’s cellphone and wallet have not been returned to him already, Respondents are directed to do so immediately.”) (Joun. J.); *Jeanfranco Alejandro Flores Salazar*, No. 25-11159-LTS, at *15 (June 11, 2025) (ECF No. 26) (“His Petition ... is ALLOWED. Patricia Hyde, Acting Director of ICE’s Boston Field Office, and/or an ICE official who supervises her and has the legal authority to carry out this Order, shall RELEASE Flores Salazar from GPS monitoring and intensive supervision FORTHWITH.”) (Sorokin, J.).
