MOTION FOR TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER AND PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION

Petitioner, Vraj Dilipbhai Patel, by and through undersigned counsel, files for a

Temporary Restraining Order to be followed by a preliminary injunction pursuant to Rule 65 of
the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. In support thereof state as follows:

1. As Petitioner notes in his Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus (Dkt. 1), which is hereby incorporated by reference, Petitioner is currently at risk of being involuntarily moved to a new immigration detention facility and involuntarily removed from the United States because the Respondents have detained him and have allegedly placed Petitioner in expedited removal proceedings. Petitioner is also being severely harmed in other ways as noted in the Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus.

- 2. The actions of the Respondents violate the due process clause of the Fifth Amendment to the United States Constitution and the Immigration and Nationality Act.
- 3. Petitioner is being caused irreparable harm for which there is no adequate remedy at law.
- 4. The harm that Plaintiff is being caused and is facing in the future far outweigh any harm that a temporary restraining order will cause the Respondents.
- 5. The public interest will be served by the issuance of a temporary restraining order.
- 6. In addition to his Motion for Temporary Restraining Order and Preliminary Injunction, Petitioner separately submits his memorandum of law, which is also incorporated by reference.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner requests that this Court enter a temporary restraining order that enjoin Respondents from directly or indirectly enforcing, implementing, or otherwise taking any action or imposing any legal consequences- including moving or removing Petitioner- as a result of that decision pending the instant case, and after a briefing and hearing enter a preliminary injunction continuing the temporary restraining order, and for all other proper relief.
