RESPONDENT'S OPPOSITION TO PETITIONER'S WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS AND MOTION TO DISMISS

Respondents, through undersigned counsel Thomas Corcoran and Charles Gayle, Assistant United States Attorneys for the District of Maryland, respond to Petitioner's Writ of Habeas Corpus and request that it be denied. Further, the Respondents move under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 12(b)(1) to dismiss the Petition. The two independent bases to deny, and ultimately dismiss, this Petition jurisdictionally include (1) 8 U.S.C. §1252(b)(9), which limits judicial review of questions of law and fact arising from review of judicial orders of removal to the appropriate court of appeals, not district courts, and (2) 8 U.S.C. §1252(g), which bars district court review of any "decision or action by [ICE] to . . . execute removal orders." *Mapoy v. Carroll*, 185 F.3d 224, 230 (4th Cir. 1999). Finally, Petitioner's detention complies with the Immigration and Nationality Act ("INA"), its implementing regulations, and the Constitution, warranting denial of the Petition. 8 U.S.C. § 1231(a).
