20 The parties submit this Joint Status Report to apprise the Court of developments in this matter.

21 1. As previously reported, on August 12, 2025, the Immigration Court granted the motion of  
22 Respondent Department of Homeland Security (“DHS”) to schedule a pre-deprivation bond hearing for  
23 Petitioner. The hearing was scheduled for January 20, 2026. The Immigration Court denied DHS’s  
24 motion to advance the pre-deprivation bond hearing and DHS’s motion for reconsideration, in part.

25 2. On November 1, 2025, Petitioner was arrested for a third time and charged with  
26 additional felonies in Santa Clara County arising from an incident that began just before midnight on  
27 October 31, 2025 and continued into the morning of November 1, 2025. A five-count complaint was  
28 filed charging Petitioner with two felonies—vandalism and resisting arrest—and three misdemeanors,

1 including the use and possession of a controlled substance (fentanyl).

2 3. On November 10, 2025, DHS filed a second motion to advance the pre-deprivation bond  
3 hearing in light of the recent arrest.

4 4. On November 24, 2025, the Immigration Court granted the motion and advanced the  
5 hearing by 13 days, from January 20, 2026 to January 7, 2026.

6 5. On December 9, 2025, DHS received notice that the January 7, 2026 hearing was  
7 cancelled. No notice was issued for a rescheduled pre-deprivation hearing.

8 6. On December 15, 2025, DHS filed a second motion to schedule a pre-deprivation  
9 hearing. On January 7, 2026, the Immigration Court issued a Notice of In-Person Hearing scheduling the  
10 pre-deprivation hearing for January 23, 2026.

11 7. The pre-deprivation hearing was held on January 23, 2026. The immigration judge did  
12 not rule from the bench but indicated that a written decision would be issued. No decision has yet been  
13 issued as of the date of filing of this report.

14 8. As previously reported, on September 12, 2025, Respondents filed a protective notice of  
15 appeal of this Court's order granting a preliminary injunction in accordance with Justice Manual § 2-  
16 2.132. The process to determine whether an appeal of the preliminary injunction order will be taken  
17 ongoing. Accordingly, Respondents filed an unopposed motion for a 60-day extension of deadlines in  
18 the appeal, and the motion was granted. The deadline for filing the opening brief in the appeal is  
19 February 9, 2026. Respondents filed a second unopposed motion for a 60-day extension of deadlines on  
20 February 2, 2026, and are awaiting an order granting that motion. If granted, Respondents' opening  
21 brief will be due April 10, 2026.

22 9. Two criminal cases against Petitioner remain pending—the case in Santa Clara County  
23 for felony vandalism arising from the May 2025 incident; and the five-count complaint pending in Santa  
24 Clara County arising from the most recent arrest.

25 10. Criminal proceedings in the third criminal case, the five-felony count complaint pending  
26 in Alameda County Superior Court relating to his July 27, 2025, arrest for attempted car-jacking, were  
27 suspended following the November 18, 2025, grant of a petition for Mental Health Diversion under  
28 Penal Code § 1001.36.

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11. Petitioner returned to a residential treatment program on November 26, 2025, and according to his counsel, Petitioner currently remains in ~~\_\_\_\_\_~~ program.
