

### Personal Custody Review Letter

My name is Guilherme Souza Aquino (A [REDACTED]) I have been in ICE custody since January 15, 2025, and during this time I have already been transferred through more than five different detention centers.

At the time of my arrest, I had a deportation order. Currently, that removal is pending. There is no longer any legal basis for me to remain detained. I do not have any other pending cases or issues that would justify my continued detention. To this day, I have never had a hearing before the Immigration Court, and I also do not have any future hearing scheduled.

I have already been in custody for many months, far beyond what would be considered reasonable. This has been very difficult and has placed a heavy burden on my life. Despite this, I have always respected all the rules during my detention and have fully cooperated with ICE. I have had no disciplinary issues.

I have a sponsor and my family ready to receive me, ensuring that I comply with all ICE requirements, including address updates and appearances at immigration hearings. I am not a danger to the community, nor a flight risk. I am a hardworking, honest, caring, and respectful person toward my family and community. I only ask for the opportunity to continue my life in freedom while my case moves forward.

Respectfully, I request that ICE exercise its discretion and grant me release under an Order of Supervision, or under any other conditions deemed appropriate.

- Most of the time your case is pending, the process status will not change. This is because we are working on cases that were filed before your case.
- When we make a decision on your case or if we need something from you, we will notify you by mail and update our systems.
- If you do not receive an initial decision or update from us within our current processing time, contact the UCC at 1-800-375-5283 or visit our website at [www.uscis.gov](http://www.uscis.gov).

**If your address changes** - Aliens must report a change of address within ten (10) days of moving within the United States or its territories. To file a change of address visit the USCIS website at [www.uscis.gov/addresschange](http://www.uscis.gov/addresschange) or call UCC at 1-800-375-5283 (TDD number is 1-800-767-1833).

**Return of Original Documents** - Use Form G-884, Request for the Return of Original Documents, to request the return of original documents submitted to establish eligibility for an immigration or citizenship benefit. You only need to submit one Form G-884 if you are requesting multiple documents contained in a single USCIS file. However, if the requested documentation is in more than one USCIS file, you must submit a separate request for each file. (For example: If you wish to obtain your mother's birth certificate and your mother's/father's marriage certificate, both of which are in the USCIS file that pertains to her, submit one Form G-884 with your mother's information.)



We may review public information and records, contact others by mail, the internet or phone, conduct site inspections of businesses and residences, or use other methods of verification. We will use the information obtained to determine whether you are eligible for the benefit you seek. If we find any derogatory information, we will follow the law in determining whether to provide you (and the legal representative listed on your Form G-28, if you submitted one) an opportunity to address that information before we make a formal decision on your case or start proceedings.

**To the Immigration Court / Competent Authority,**

**Ref.: Removal Letter – Fundamental Reasons**

Dear Sirs,

Through this letter, we present the reasons that justify the receipt of the removal letter from the country, as follows:

1. **Inadequate notification:** we informed the attorney about our change of address to Florida; however, he did not properly notify the competent authorities, so we did not receive essential notifications for following up on the case.
2. **Communication issues:** although a translator was initially present in meetings, this support was not maintained in subsequent encounters, which created language barriers that hindered effective communication with our legal representative.
3. **Procedural misunderstandings:** we believed that our case would be transferred to Florida and were unaware of the obligation to appear at the hearing in New Jersey; in addition, the absence of a translator during the hearing prevented us from fully understanding the discussions conducted by the judge and the attorney.
4. **Financial constraints:** we used our savings to hire an attorney initially, but after moving, we could not afford another professional, nor did we receive financial support from local organizations in Florida.

These combined factors created critical gaps in access to information and due process, which culminated in the receipt of the removal letter.
