Grounds for Your Challenge in This Petition

13. State every ground (reason) that supports your claim that you are being held in violation of the Constitution, laws, or treaties of the United States. GROUND ONE: Violations of Due Process. Prolonged detention can raise serious due process concerns under the Fifth Amendment because I have no opportunity for a Bond Hearing due to my referral for an expedited removal proceedings after passing the Credible Fear Interview. "It is well established that the Fifth Amendment entitles aliens to due process of law in deportation proceedings." Demore v. Kim, 538 U.S. 510, 523 (2003).

(a) Supporting facts (Be brief. Do not cite cases or law.):

I am detained since September 3, 2024. After passing the Credible Fear (CF) Interview, I was referred to the Immigration Court for removal proceedings. The trial was postponed three times. In the meantime, I am a minor separated from my family. I am a rider on my mother's asylum claim and should be included in my mother's trial proceedings. At a minimum, I believe I should be accorded a Bond hearing for my prolonged detention before the Immigration Court on this Court's Order.

(b) Did you present Ground One in all appeals that were available to you?

GROUND TWO: I am a minor (currently 19) held in an adult detention facility. I feel very uncomfortable, depressed, and scared. I am separated from my family. I am faced now with removal to the country of my family's persecution alone, leaving my family to defend their asylum claim in a non-detained immigration court; whereas I could be removed back to Georgia and be there alone without my family.

(a) Supporting facts (Be brief. Do not cite cases or law.):

At the time of crossing the border between Mexico and the United States, I was 18. I came with my family: my mother, my brother, and my step-father. I was separated from them. My family was released and went to Philadelphia to the family's sponsor. But I was detained and now at the South Louisiana ICE processing Center in Basile, LA.

(b) Did you present Ground Two in all appeals that were available to you?

GROUND THREE: On the precedent by the Supreme Court in Zadvydas v. Davis, 533 U.S. 678 (2001).

The decision is rooted in the Due Process Clause of the Fifth Amendment, which protects aliens from being deprived of liberty without due process of law. The Court's interpretation of the statute, along with the presumption of a six-month limit on detention, aimed to avoid constitutional questions of indefinite detention.

(a) Supporting facts (Be brief. Do not cite cases or law.):

I am in detention for over 6 months and in September 2025 it will be a year. My next Individual hearing is scheduled for August 20, 2025. This Individual hearing was continued already three times and there is no guarantee that it will happen on time scheduled. In the mean time I am severely depressed away from my family. Then it will be almost a year in detention. I am a minor in an adult facility. I can't bear it alone any more.

(b) Did you present Ground Three in all appeals that were available to you?

GROUND FOUR: Prolong Detention pursuant to Jennings v. Rodriguez, 138 S.Ct. 830 (2018).

Due process requires that the government provide bond hearings to non-citizens facing prolonged detention.

"The Due Process Clause foresees eligibility for bail as part of due process" because "[b]ail is basic to our system of law." (Id. at *28 Breyer, J., dissenting). See Jennings v. Rodriguez, ___ U.S. ___, 2018 WL 1054878 (Feb 27, 2018)

(a) Supporting facts (*Be brief. Do not cite cases or law.*):

I entered the United States on September 3, 2024. I was 18 at the time. I was separated from my family and placed at the adult detention facility. I went through CF interview and was referred to Immigration Court for removal proceedings. My individual hearing was continued three times. I am a minor amongst adults and I experience a severe mental stress disorders summarized in the letter by my psychologist (attached). I am separated from my family, never was, and in distress. I am seeking release from detention to join my family and allow me to be in the removal process with my family. In the alternative, I ask this Court to Order a Bond hearing.

I am a minor, separated from my family, in an adult detention facility. I don't know all the laws and all the grounds. My main ground for requesting release from detention is my present mental condition that deprives me of any other reasonable thoughts: I can't be away from my family any more. I believe am eligible for Special Immigrant Juvenile Status (SIJS), but cannot apply for it in detention.

Request for Relief

15. State exactly what you want the court to do: Release from ICE custody to join my family residing in Pennsylvania. The family is in removal proceedings there in an open immigration court and I am a Rider on my mother's asylum claim. In the alternative, to Order a Bond hearing with the Immigration Judge. please also review my personal statement.


