21	INTRODUCTION	
22	On August 5, 2025, this Court issued an Order (Doc. 14) granting Petitioner's	
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23	Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order and Preliminary Injunction (Doc. 2). The	
24	Court ordered Petitioner released from the custody of United States Immigration and	
25	Customs Enforcement ("ICE"). Doc. 14. On August 6, 2025, ICE released Petitioner	
26	from immigration custody pursuant to an Order of Release on Recognizance. See Doc.	
27	15, Exhibit A. On August 7, 2025, Respondents filed a status report indicating to the	
28	Court that Petitioner had been released. Doc. 15. On August 12, 2025, Petitioner filed a	

status report making several allegations against Respondents about the circumstances concerning Petitioner's release from ICE custody. Doc. 16. On August 14, 2025, the Court ordered Respondents to respond to the allegations in Petitioner's status report concerning the circumstance of Petitioner's release from ICE custody. Doc. 17. Respondents responded to the allegations on August 19, 2025. Doc. 19.

On August 20, 2025, the Court issued an order noting that Respondents had acknowledged in their status update that they had released Petitioner on August 6, 2025, subject to ankle monitoring and were continuing to hold Petitioner's governmental documents, including Petitioner's driver's license and work authorization card. Doc. 20. The Court further noted that despite entry of non-opposition to the Temporary Restraining Order, Petitioner was not restored to the status quo ante because he was still subject to ankle monitoring and has not had his government documents returned. *Id.* The Court ordered Respondents to file a status update explaining why Petitioner was not released pursuant to the "status quo." *Id.*

STATUS UPDATE IN RESPONSE TO COURT'S AUGUST 20, 2025 ORDER

On August 6, 2025, Petitioner was released subject to an ankle monitor as part of the Alternatives to Detention Program (ATD), by Phoenix Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO), which was charged with supervising his release. Doc. 19, Exhibit A. On August 25, 2025, Petitioner reported to Phoenix ICE-ERO. Exhibit A. When he reported to ICE/ERO, his participation in the ATD program was terminated and his ankle monitor removed. *Id.* Petitioner is no longer subject to any restrictions on his release. *Id.* Also on August 25, 2025, Petitioner's government issued documents, including his driver's license and work authorization card were mailed to Petitioner by next day mail. Exhibit B. Accordingly, Petitioner has been restored to status quo ante.
