The United States of America moves to withdraw its Unopposed Motion to Stay Case in Light of Lapse of Appropriations, ECF No. 9. The government filed the motion on November 6, 2025, as Defendant's answer deadline was approaching and counsel for the government was prohibited from participated in on-going settlement negotiations, even on a voluntary basis, after the appropriations to the U.S. Department of Justice lapsed.

Good cause exists to grant this unopposed motion because the motion is moot. On November 12, 2025, Congress appropriated funds for the Department, and Department attorneys were permitted to resume their civil litigation functions as of November 13, 2025. The parties have continued settlement negotiations and intend to file a joint stipulation extending Defendant's answer deadline.

On November 21, 2025, undersigned counsel for the government conferred with counsel for Defendant and was informed that Defendant does not oppose this motion.
