**RESPONDENTS' RESPONSE TO  
ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE**

19 On December 17, 2025, Respondents issued a written notice to Petitioner titled  
20 "TERMINATION OF PAROLE PURSUANT TO 8 C.F.R. § 212.5(e)," and signed by U.S.  
21 Immigration and Customs Enforcement, Assistant Field Officer Director Jorge Velarde.

22 On December 23, 2025, the Court issued an order instructing Respondents to address  
23 whether: (1) the notice issued to Petitioner was signed by a "statutorily authorized official;"  
24 (2) Respondents provided "individualized grounds for the termination of parole" in the  
25 notice issued to Petitioner; and (3) Petitioner was given "an opportunity to rebut the  
26 revocation of parole." (ECF No. 8).

27 The notice was signed by a statutorily authorized official pursuant to 8 C.F.R. §  
28 212.5(e)(2)(i), which authorizes the termination of parole "when in the opinion of one of

1 the officials listed in paragraph (a) of this section, neither humanitarian reasons nor public  
2 benefit warrants the continued presence of the alien in the United States...” Among the  
3 officials listed in paragraph (a) are field office directors and deputy field office directors.  
4 Here, the notice was properly issued by Assistant Field Office Director Jorge Velarde under  
5 the auspices of the Field Office Director after a determination that neither urgent  
6 humanitarian reasons nor significant public benefit warrant Petitioner’s continued parole.

7 As to Court’s other two inquiries, Respondents do not have additional information to  
8 supplement the record at this time.
