EMERGENCY PETITION FOR
TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER
AND TEMPORARY INJUNCTION

COMES NOW, Petitioner: Jose A. Martir-Martinez, pro-se without representation of counsel and without any judicial disabilities, files motion for temporary restraining order and temporary injunction for cause; to wit:

Petitioner avers and declares that the following facts are true and correct, under the penalty of perjury [18 USC § 1746]. Petitioner request this Honorable Court issue a TRO and temporary injunction, restraining respondents, agents, successors and or assign and others working in concert from deporting him back to El Salvador and any other country unknown to him that would jeopardize his life

health and well being in violation of Petitioner's constitutional protections and rights of due process and liberty interest.

This matter referred to herein of Petitioner's dire circumstances are well settled and well known and the government that Petitioner is unable to return to El Salvador under any condition as his life has already been threatened, his family members have been killed, his father had been shot, hospitalized and his mother has fled as a result of being kidnapped, held a gun point for ransom, all as a result of El Salvador's government factions and gang members that are working in concert with said government.

These truths are certified in the Immigration forms, inclusive of Form I-589 and other papers, motions, petitions, memoranda certified on the record of his immigration documents reviewed and made part of this filing by reference. See: Attached documents.

This Honorable Court and or the clerk of this court should adjudicate and issue this Great Writ of Habeas Corpus inclusive the the requested TRO under the emergency Powers granted by Congress and the United States Constitution and Emergency powers as a matter of law.
