

2. In the supplemental filing, the Petitioner asserts that “the Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus is more accurately described as a challenge of the improper revocation of parole.” Dkt. 11 at 2. Again, there are no details about what was improper about the parole revocation. It is clear that Petitioner believes that his parole should not have been revoked but that, standing alone, is insufficient to overcome the jurisdictional bar in § 1252(a). *See* Dkt. 9 at 6-7(citing cases); *see also Ayala-Roel v. Horne*, No. 1:17-CV-129, 2017 WL 7792616, at *4 (S.D. Tex. Oct. 27, 2017) (holding that parole was a discretionary decision within the meaning of the statute and the court therefore lacked jurisdiction) (citing *Hassan v. Chertoff*, 593 F.3d 785, 788 (9th Cir. 2010)).

3. The Government acknowledges that courts have recognized an alien’s ability to challenge the revocation of parole by pointing to specific process requirements that DHS allegedly failed to follow. *See, e.g., Aracely, R. v. Nielsen*, 319 F. Supp. 3d 110, 135 (D.D.C. 2018) (“While § 1252(a)(2)(B)(ii) undoubtedly bars judicial review of individual parole decisions, courts have declined to apply it to claims challenging the legality of policies and processes governing discretionary decisions under the INA.”). But this is not one of those cases. Again, Petitioner only makes general assertions attacking the decision to end his parole. That is insufficient. Indeed, the habeas petition and supplemental filing do not reference a specific policy that is allegedly unlawful or any process (*i.e.*, regulation) that was allegedly violated in the revocation of Petitioner’s parole.

For the foregoing reasons and those set forth in the Government’s response and motion for summary judgment, the instant habeas petition should be denied.
