RESPONDENTS' RESPONSE TO THE COURT'S ORDER TO RESPOND

Respondents, by and through undersigned counsel, respond to the Court's January 5, 2026 Order to Respond (the "Order"). Dkt. 27.

Previously, Respondents indicated that they made "no requests for standard conditions, and declin[ed] to provide a position regarding what terms of supervision, if any, should apply." *See* Dkt. 26 at 1 n.1 (internal quotation marks omitted). In the Order, the Court directed Respondents "no later than two days from the day of this order to respond with its proposed conditions." Dkt. 27 at 1.

If the Court is inclined to grant Petitioner's habeas petition, it is Respondents' position that the Court should issue an order (1) directing ICE to release Petitioner from custody; and (2) directing ICE to issue a Form I-220B, Order of Supervision, with the conditions contained in the I-220B. *See* Ex. 1. ICE requests that all the conditions contained in the Form I-220B be imposed.
