PETITION FOR WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS
COMES NOW Petitioner, JOSE LUIS ROJO MATIAS (A#),
currently detained at the GEO Folkston ICE Processing Center located at
3026 Hwy 252 E, Folkston, GA 31537, and files this Petition for Writ of
Habeas Corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2241.

Petitioner was detained by Immigration and Customs Enforcement
(ICE) on August 21, 2025. He has no criminal record, poses no danger to
the community, and has strong ties to his family and community.

On August 20, 2025, one day before his detention, Petitioner's wife and
daughters suffered a catastrophic motor vehicle rollover accident. His
daughter, , was airlifted and spent two weeks in intensive
care. His other daughter, was hospitalized for several
days, and his wife, Heliz De Sablon, was also treated and hospitalized for
an undetermined number of days. Their recovery has been physically
and emotionally traumatic.

Petitioner's continued detention violates the Fifth Amendment Due Process Clause. His family is experiencing severe hardship, and the government has no lawful basis to continue his detention. Petitioner is not a flight risk, has decades of residence, and has demonstrated consistent moral character.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully requests that this Court:

1. Issue a Writ of Habeas Corpus ordering his immediate release;
2. Grant any further relief the Court deems just and proper.

My name is Heliz De Sablon J, and I am writing this letter from the bottom of my heart to ask for understanding and compassion for my husband, Jose Luis Rojo Matias who is currently detained by immigration authorities.

My husband and I have been together for over 30 years, sharing a life full of hard work, sacrifices, and love. We have two wonderful daughters, Natalia and Victoria, who have grown up seeing the example of a loving, responsible father who has always given everything for his family.

On August 20th, our lives changed forever. We suffered a tragic accident, a day we will never forget. Our daughter [REDACTED] had to be airlifted and spent two weeks in intensive care, fighting for her life. My other daughter [REDACTED] and I were also taken to the hospital with injuries and great pain.

My husband, in the middle of the chaos and fear of seeing his family hurt and believing he might lose us, panicked. It was a moment of confusion and deep distress that sadly ended with the police taking him away. It was not an act of malice, it was a human reaction of fear and desperation.

Since that day, our home has felt empty. My daughters and I feel his absence every single minute. He is not only our financial support, since we run a small family business together that he and our daughter [REDACTED] now struggle to maintain --- but he is also the heart and strength of our family.




My name is [REDACTED], and I write this letter with all my heart to share the tragedy that my family and I experienced on August 20, 2025—a day that changed our lives forever.

That day, my mother, my sister, and I were in a terrible car accident. It was a moment filled with fear, pain, and chaos. 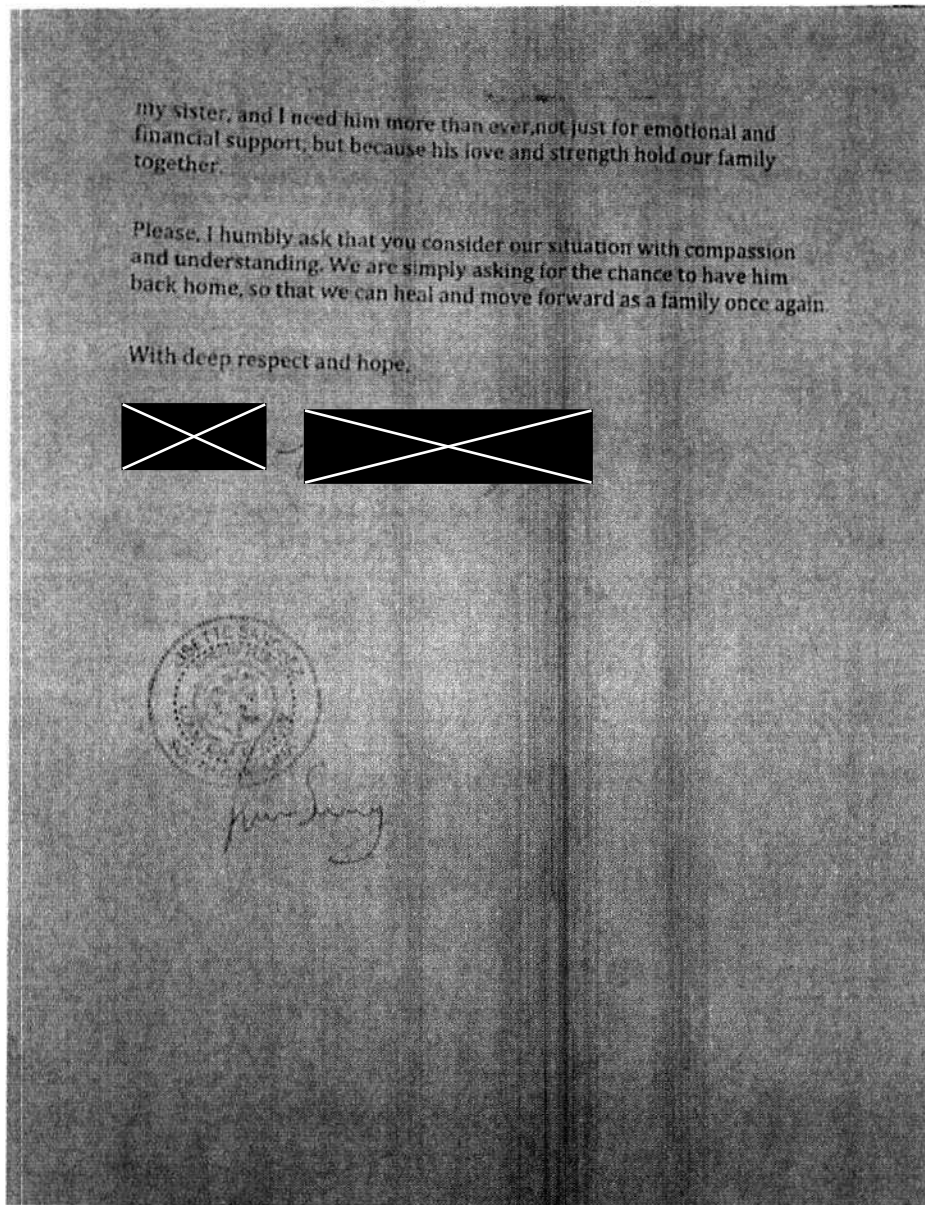

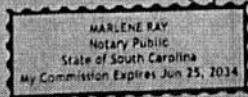

My name is Bronco Bostick, and I had the privilege of serving as the Mayor of the City of Hardeeville in South Carolina. I am writing today on behalf of Mr. Jose Luis Rojo Matias, a man I have known for more than thirty years through community involvement, shared service, and local development.

Throughout this time, I have known Mr. Rojo Matias as a devoted husband and father, a hardworking business owner, and a man who cares deeply about the wellbeing of others. He has created employment opportunities for many residents in our community. He has supported individuals who were facing homelessness by offering work and stability. He has volunteered as a youth football coach and has consistently contributed to the community without seeking recognition or reward. The events that led to his detention occurred in the midst of a traumatic and life altering crisis. Mr. Rojo Matias witnessed his wife and young daughters involved in a devastating collision with a tractor trailer. When he reached them, he believed he was watching his family slip away from him. The fear and anguish of that moment overwhelmed him. His reaction was the response of a husband and father who thought he was losing the people who mattered most to him in the world.

His wife and daughters spent weeks in intensive care. They continue to require medical support and rehabilitation. During this time, they have had to endure recovery without the comforting presence of their husband and father. The emotional weight of that absence cannot be measured in words.

In addition to the impact on his family, his businesses have suffered greatly during his confinement. Employees who depended on him for their livelihood have been left without direction. Families who relied on that income have been placed in uncertainty. The community has felt this loss in a very real and painful way.

Your Honor, I ask with sincerity that you consider not only the moment of distress that brought him into custody, but the thirty years of character, responsibility, and humanity that define who he truly is. Mr. Rojo Matias is not a threat to public safety. He is a man who has consistently worked to build, to support, and to uplift the people around him.

To continue to keep him separated from his family extends the suffering of a family that has already endured the unimaginable. His wife and daughters need him at home. Our community needs him present. His life's actions demonstrate loyalty, love, stability, and moral character.

I respectfully and earnestly request your compassion as you review his case. I trust that fairness and humanity will guide your decision. Thank you for your time and your thoughtful consideration.

Honorable Immigration Judge,

My name is [REDACTED] Rojo, and I am writing this letter with great respect to explain what happened on the day of the accident and to ask for compassion and understanding toward my father, José Luis Rojo Matias, who was detained by immigration under very difficult circumstances for our family.

That day, my mother, my sister, and I were about to enter our home when a truck hit us from behind. The impact caused our car to crash into another vehicle, and our car rolled over several times — about seven times. I was thrown out of the car approximately 40 yards away.

I had to be airlifted to the hospital by helicopter. I suffered serious injuries to my head, back, and ribs, and I was in the Intensive Care Unit for two weeks. I do not remember everything that happened, but I know that my father only wanted to help us that day.

When he saw me lying on the ground, covered in blood, he was in complete shock. He was terrified and heartbroken seeing me in that condition. My father did nothing wrong; he was simply reacting as any loving father would — trying to protect and help his family during a tragedy.

Since his detention, our family has suffered greatly. My father is a good, hardworking, and responsible man. He is the heart of our family, and his absence has made everything even more difficult as we continue to heal from this traumatic event.

Because of the accident and all the emotional stress, my mother has not been able to work for almost three months. My father, José Luis Rojo Matias, has always been the main financial support of our family. Without him, it has been very hard to cover our basic needs and keep up with medical and household expenses.

Your Honor, we truly and urgently need my father to be here with us.

I am still recovering physically and emotionally from the accident, and my mother and sister are struggling every day to stay strong. My father's presence is not only important — it is essential for our family's well-being. He gives us stability, hope, and comfort. His love and support help us face the emotional and financial challenges we are going through.

Having him home would help us continue to heal as a family. I respectfully ask that you show compassion and allow my father to remain with us, where he belongs — with his wife and daughters, who love him and need him deeply.

Dear JOSE ROJO MATIAS:

This letter is in response to your request for records under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) or Privacy Act (PA), which was received in this office on November 5, 2025.

We have completed our search and no records responsive to your request were located.

We could not find records matching the subject of record's date of birth provided in your request.

You have the right to file an administrative appeal within 90 days of the date of this letter. By filing an appeal, you preserve your rights under FOIA and give the agency a chance to review and reconsider your request and the agency's decision. You may file an administrative FOIA appeal electronically to USCIS through your online portal by selecting Appeal in the Actions drop down window. You may also file an administrative FOIA appeal to USCIS at: USCIS FOIA/PA Appeals Office, 150 Space Center Loop, Suite 500, Lee's Summit, MO 64064-2139. Both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."

If you would like to discuss our response before filing an appeal to attempt to resolve your dispute without going through the appeals process, you may contact our USCIS FOIA Public Liaison at U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services, National Records Center, FOIA/PA Office, P.O. Box 648010, Lee's Summit, MO 64064-8010, or by email at FOIAPAQuestions@uscis.dhs.gov.

A USCIS FOIA Public Liaison is an agency official to whom FOIA requesters can raise concerns about the service the requester has received from the agency's FOIA Office. USCIS FOIA Public Liaisons are responsible for assisting in reducing delays, increasing transparency, and understanding of the status of requests, and assisting in the resolution of disputes.

If you are unable to resolve your FOIA dispute through our USCIS FOIA Public Liaison, you may contact the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) at the National Archives and Records Administration to inquire about the FOIA mediation services they offer.
