JOINT ADVISORY

The Parties submit this joint status report and advise the Court that there has been a significant change in the posture of Petitioner's immigration case. On December 16, 2025, DHS filed a motion to dismiss removal proceedings because the NTA was improvidently issued. The immigration court has yet to rule on the matter. The parties anticipate that the immigration court is likely to grant the motion, and it will lead to the release of the petitioner. This would in fact moot the entire petition.

Although the parties can not be certain how long it will take the immigration court to rule on the matter, the parties agree, in the interests of persevering judicial resources, that the Court should suspend briefing on the matter for at least 7 days. They will provide an update to the Court on December 23, 2025, as to the status of the immigration proceedings.
