

to Aurora, Colorado. To ensure the Court's ability to meaningfully address Petitioner's claim, Petitioner seeks a Protective Order from his transfer to outside the District of Colorado.

4. To be clear, Petitioner does not presently seek a Temporary Restraining Order, but instead a Protective Order under the Court's inherent power to preserve and its ability to hear the case. *See, e.g.*, Order Concerning Service of Petition and Stay of Transfer or Removal, *Teixeira v. ICE Burlington*, No. 25-cv-11631 (D. Mass. June 5, 2025), ECF No. 5; *see also Alves v. U.S. Dep't of Just.*, No. 3-25-cv-306-KC, 2025 WL 2629763, at *5 (W.D. Tex. Sept. 12, 2025).

WHEREFORE PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner requests that this Motion be granted.
