



3. As a Deportation Officer, my assigned duties are to identify, locate, and arrest aliens illegally present in the United States. Additionally, I am charged with the responsibility of overseeing the cases of aliens in removal proceedings. These duties include the review of alien files for sufficiency, the detention and release of aliens in ICE custody, monitoring the progress of cases through the hearing process, and enforcement of the immigration court's decision, including the execution of removal orders. I am also responsible for presenting criminal immigration cases to the United States Attorney's Office for possible criminal prosecution.

4. The documents attached to this declaration are true and accurate copies of documents from the immigration records on Liban Ali Osman (hereinafter "Osman") kept in the ordinary course of business by immigration officials at ICE/ERO.

5. Liban Ali OSMAN (hereinafter referred to as "OSMAN") is a citizen and national of Somalia. OSMAN entered the United States on June 24, 1999 at New York, NY as the child of an asylee.

6. On August 11, 2004, the Delaware County Court of Common Pleas in Delaware, Ohio convicted OSMAN of Robbery and sentenced him to three years of Community Control.

7. On March 18, 2006, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) granted OSMAN adjustment of status to Lawful Permanent Resident retroactive to March 18, 2005.

8. On June 4, 2007, the Franklin County Court of Common Pleas at Columbus, Ohio convicted OSMAN of Robbery and sentenced him to three years in prison.

9. On February 12, 2008, ICE/ERO at Cleveland, Ohio issued a Form I-862, Notice

to Appear to OSMAN, alleging removability under Section 237(a)(2)(A)(iii) of the INA, at the Noble Correctional Institution at Caldwell, Ohio. See Exhibit A.

10. On July 17, 2008, the Franklin County Court of Common Pleas convicted OSMAN of Receiving Stolen Property, and sentenced him to five years of Community Control.

11. On January 28, 2010, the Franklin County Court of Common Pleas convicted OSMAN of Robbery and Assault on a Police Officer, and sentenced him to one year on each count, served concurrently.

12. On October 28, 2010, DHS served OSMAN Form I-261, Additional Charges of Inadmissibility/Deportability. See Exhibit B.

13. On January 25, 2011, ICE/ERO took OSMAN into custody upon his release from the Ohio Department of Corrections for continuation of removal proceedings.

14. On April 25, 2011, an Immigration Judge at Cleveland, Ohio ordered OSMAN removed from the United States to Somalia. See Exhibit C. The Immigration Judge also granted OSMAN Deferral of Removal to Somalia. See Exhibit D.

15. On August 15, 2011, ICE/ERO released OSMAN on an Order of Supervision. See Exhibit E.

16. On December 8, 2025, ICE/ERO revoked OSMAN's Order of Supervision. See Exhibit F. ICE/ERO issued a Warrant for his arrest and took him into custody. See Exhibits G and H.

17. ICE Headquarters and Removal Operations is actively working with Department of State and the Department of Homeland Security on third country removal logistics for OSMAN.

18. Additionally, on December 15, 2025, the Department of Homeland Security filed a Motion to Reopen in Order to Terminate Grant of Deferral of Removal under the Convention Against Torture. See Exhibit I. This is the first step toward OSMAN's removal if DHS were to seek removal to Somalia in the alternative.

19. ICE Headquarters and Removal Operations believes there is a significant likelihood that OSMAN's removal to Somali or a third country can be effectuated in the reasonably foreseeable future.

20. On this basis, ICE/ERO revoked Osman's Order of Supervision and detained him on December 8, 2025. ICE/ERO is currently detaining OSMAN in the Kandiyohi County Jail, Willmar, Minnesota,
