INJUNCTION**

1 On December 16, 2025, the Court issued an order [Dkt. 11] providing that the
2 Respondents are enjoined from continuing to detain the Petitioner unless he is provided a
3 bond hearing before an immigration judge pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1226(a). The Court's
4 order further required Respondents to show cause as to why a preliminary injunction
5 should not issue. The TRO was subsequently extended to January 6, 2026 [Dkt. 15].
6 Respondents hereby show such cause.

7 Petitioner's bond hearing was scheduled at the Adelanto Immigration Court on
8 December 22, 2025. At the hearing, Petitioner was granted bond in the amount of
9 \$8,000. *See* Order of the Immigration Judge in the Matter of Reyes Zamora-Vazquez,
10 dated Dec. 22, 2025. The Petitioner posted bond and was released from ICE custody on
11 December 24, 2025.

12 Providing the Petitioner with the 1226(a) bond hearing moots the requested
13 preliminary injunction and this habeas petition more generally. *See, e.g., Javier Gonzales*
14 *et al. v. Kristi Noem et al.*, 5:25-cv-02054-ODW-BFM, Dkt. no. 16 (August 25, 2025
15 minute order by Hon. Judge Wright, denying as moot the petitioners' pending request for
16 a preliminary injunction given their receipt pursuant to a TRO of 1226(a) bond hearings
17 and issuing the petitioners an order to show cause re: dismissal); Dkt. no. 17 (notice of
18 voluntary dismissal); and Dkt. no. 18 (order dismissing petition). *See also Edgar*
19 *Becerra Ortiz v. Todd Lyons et al.*, 2:25-cv-09831-MWC-KES, Dkt. no. 7 (October 21
20 order by this Court granting TRO for § 1226(a) bond hearing within seven days was
21 followed by a voluntary dismissal). Respondents believe the issue is mooted by the
22 TRO's issuance [Dkt. 11] and the subsequent provision of the bond hearing.

23 Accordingly, the OSC re: preliminary injunction should be discharged, and the
24 Petitioner should either voluntarily dismiss the Petition or else be required to respond to
25 an OSC re: Dismissal.
