ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

This is a habeas corpus action brought pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2241 by an individual detained by the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE). Petitioner challenges the lawfulness of his current detention. He asks the Court to declare that 8 U.S.C. § 1226(a) is the appropriate statutory provision governing his detention and issue a writ of habeas corpus ordering Respondents to provide him with a bond hearing pursuant to the statute within seven (7) days or release him. Petitioner also seeks an award of his attorneys' fees and costs for this action under the Equal Access to Justice Act, 28 U.S.C. § 2412.

The Court has reviewed the application and, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2243, orders as follows:

1. The Clerk of Court shall serve copies of the petition and this order on Respondents and the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Michigan.
2. On or before the third business day after entry of this order, Respondents shall show cause in writing why the writ of habeas corpus and other relief requested in the petition should not be granted.
3. Petitioner shall file a written reply on or before the third business day after Respondents file their response to this show cause order.
4. The Court will schedule a hearing, if necessary, after the parties file their submissions.
