**MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION OF PETITIONER'S**  
**MOTION FOR WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS AD TESTIFICANDUM**

Petitioner Abdoul Karimou Diallo respectfully requests that the Court reconsider its decision, ECF 63, on his Motion for Writ of Habeas Corpus Ad Testificandum, ECF 61, and permit him to appear and testify virtually, on Zoom, at the March 4, 2026 hearing at 10:30 AM. Petitioner moves for reconsideration under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 54(b). *See Cabral v. Brennan*, 853 F.3d 763, 766 n.3 (5th Cir. 2017). Mr. Diallo does not need to attend the hearing in person. He merely asks for the opportunity to testify virtually to the matters identified in the Court's February 4, 2026 Order, ECF 43, including the circumstances of his re-detention and his current medical care and condition, *see* 28 U.S.C. § 2243 (permitting the person detained to testify as to "material facts").

The burden on Respondents to produce Mr. Diallo is minimal. Petitioner requests only that Respondents allow him to attend the hearing from Winn Correctional Center, where he is currently

detained, using the requisite technology. Respondents need not provide transportation or incur any burden or cost associated with physically producing Petitioner.

Therefore, Petitioner respectfully requests that the Court reconsider its denial of Petitioner's Motion for Writ of Habeas Corpus Ad Testificandum and order Respondents to facilitate Mr. Diallo's virtual attendance at the upcoming March 4 hearing.
