**ORDER FOR SUPPLEMENTAL
BRIEFING**

Before the Court is Petitioner Inderjeet Singh’s Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2241. ECF No. 1. Respondents previously acknowledged that Petitioner must be considered detained under 8 U.S.C. § 1226(a), pursuant to the final judgment entered in *Maldonado Bautista v. Santacruz*, No. 5:25-CV-01873-SSS-BFM, -- F. Supp. 3d ---, 2025 WL 3289861 (C.D. Cal. Nov. 20, 2025). ECF No. 8. Thus, the Court granted a bond hearing and ordered a subsequent status report. ECF No. 9. On January 5, 2026, Respondents filed a status report stating that the bond hearing was held January 2, 2026, where bond was not granted or denied, but the request was “withdrawn” to give

1 Petitioner further opportunity to provide evidence. In light of this order, the Court
2 **ORDERS** the parties to file separate status reports by **January 12, 2026**, including at least
3 the following information: (1) the status of further bond hearings, including when the next
4 hearing will be set for; and (2) each parties' respective position as to how the Court should
5 proceed with the rest of the relief Petitioner seeks in the original petition.

6 **IT IS SO ORDERED.**
