GROUND ONE: Petitioner's detention without a bond hearing under 8 U.S.C. 1225(b)(2) is in violation of the Immigration and Nationality Act, because he should be properly classified as subject to discretionary detention under 8 U.S.C. 1226(a).

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(a) Supporting facts *(Be brief. Do not cite cases or law.):*

Petitioner entered without inspection years ago as an unaccompanied minor and has a pending application for asylum. He should have the opportunity to request conditional release to pursue his asylum claim, but an Immigration Judge erroneously denied his bond, citing to an erroneous agency decision, Matter of Yajure Hurtado and misclassifying him as someone who is "arriving" despite his apprehension well within the interior of the U.S. years after he was released from a shelter for children through the Office of Refugee Resettlement.
