180-Day Custody Review Request
Humanitarian and Medical Grounds

I, Vladimir Savin (A-) , respectfully submit this request for a 180-day custody review under ICE detention procedures.

I have been in ICE custody for over a year now, during which time I have been transferred multiple times between different detention centers - including facilities in Texas, Louisiana, New Jersey, and now Colorado. In total, I've been in six detention centers during my time in custody.

These constant transfers have caused me great hardship, interrupted my legal process, and delayed access to medical care and case documents.

At present, my appeal is pending before the Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA), and I continue to fully cooperate with all legal proceedings. Despite my full compliance and good behavior, I remain detained without any meaningful review or opportunity for release.

I am also suffering from a serious medical condition - gallstones, which cause severe pain and require surgical treatment. I have not yet received the necessary surgery or continuous medical supervision while in detention. My health condition is worsening, and continued detention poses a significant risk to my well-being. At the WEBB County Detention Center in Texas, I was taken to the city hospital for an ultrasound, after which I saw a gastroenterologist. He told me I had gallstones and scheduled an appointment with a surgeon. Unfortunately, I never got to see him, due to my being moved around various detention centers.

Besides, my family has been separated from me for more than 1 year. My wife and minor son currently reside in New York, awaiting the resolution of our asylum case. The prolonged separation has caused deep emotional distress and instability for all of us.

Given these humanitarian, medical, and procedural circumstances, I respectfully request that ICE conduct a thorough 180-day custody review and consider my release under supervision, parole, or any other available form of humanitarian release. I am not a danger to the community and not a flight risk. I have a stable residence and family support in New York, where I can continue to comply with all legal requirements.

Thank you for your attention and understanding. I deeply hope for a fair review of my situation.
