**Federal Respondents' Status Report  
 regarding Updated Medical Information**

Federal Respondents submit this Status Report to provide the Court with updated factual information bearing directly on the emergency allegations raised in Petitioner's Motion for Temporary Restraining Order, ECF No. 17 ("Motion").

Petitioner's Motion seeks extraordinary relief based on allegations of immediate and irreparable harm arising from asserted deficiencies in medical care. Because emergency requests for Temporary Restraining Order are considered on an expedited and often abbreviated record, Respondents submit this Status Report to ensure the Court has current, accurate information regarding Petitioner's medical care, including developments that occurred shortly before the filing of the Motion.

Beginning on February 4, 2026, undersigned counsel and counsel for Respondent Mattos communicated with Petitioner's counsel regarding Petitioner's asserted medical needs, including the medications and dosages allegedly required. In those communications, Respondents sought clarification as to whether the medical records filed under seal

1 reflected Petitioner's current treatment requirements and whether Petitioner was declining  
2 any prescribed medication.

3 In response, and as reflected in the attached Exhibit A, Petitioner's counsel  
4 acknowledged that the medical records submitted in support of the emergency motion were  
5 not exhaustive, were dated from October 2022, and may not accurately reflect Petitioner's  
6 current medical needs. Petitioner's counsel further acknowledged that she is not a medical  
7 professional and could not opine on the medical care presently required, and that the  
8 appropriate means of determining Petitioner's treatment needs is evaluation by a qualified  
9 physician.

10 As of February 4, 2026, Respondents confirmed the following through coordination  
11 with facility-level personnel and counsel for Respondent Mattos: (1) Petitioner's prior  
12 NDOC medical records were received by Nevada Southern Detention Center medical staff;  
13 (2) Petitioner's care is being overseen by a qualified physician at the detention facility; (3)  
14 Petitioner's multiple-sclerosis medications have been ordered to ensure continuity of care.  
15 These steps reflect the very process identified by Petitioner's counsel as necessary to  
16 determine and provide appropriate medical treatment.

17 Respondents will address the legal and factual issues raised in the Petition and the  
18 Motion for Temporary Restraining Order in full in their forthcoming response. This Status  
19 Report is submitted solely to update the Court regarding material factual developments  
20 relevant to the emergency motion and to ensure that the Court's consideration of that  
21 motion is informed by the most current information available.
