I have been detained since October 25, 2025 at Folkdton Main Detetion Center. I have been detained for almost 2 months. I have not received a bond hearing. I have strong community ties and a release plan at Atlanta, GA.

GROUND TWO: Fraud / fake representative facts

Prior to receiving the removal order, Valladolid relied on a fraudulent immigration organization who claimed to be authorized to represent him. He paid approximately \$6,000 (via Zelle). He later learned that this organization did not file the promised applications or take action in his case. At his real immigration court hearing on , he discovered that no-meaningful filings had been made on his behalf, which contributed to the issuance of a removal order. He is now pursuing legitimate legal remedies (including motion to appeal) and has supporting evidence of the fraud (fake documents, emails, etc).



**EXPLANATORY LETTER IN SUPPORT OF HABEAS

Dear Honorable Court:

My name is Sofia Teodoro Fretel Mejia, and I respectfully submit this explanatory letter in support of the Habeas Corpus Petition filed on behalf of Jose Luis Valladolid Cubillas, who is currently detained by ICE at the Folkston Main Detention Center in Folkston, Georgia. The purpose of this letter is to provide additional context regarding the Petitioner's circumstances and to explain why his immediate release or, at minimum, a custody redetermination (bond) hearing is both justified and necessary.

1. Physical and Emotional Deterioration of the Petitioner

Since his detention on October 25, 2025, Mr. Valladolid Cubillas has experienced significant deterioration in his physical and emotional well-being. Despite multiple requests, he has not received adequate and timely medical attention. His continued confinement, without appropriate care, creates a substantial risk to his health and raises serious due process concerns.

2. Full Compliance With Immigration Supervision and Demonstrated Good Faith

Before his detention, Mr. Valladolid Cubillas consistently complied with immigration requirements. He remained enrolled in and compliant with the ISAP program (Intensive Supervision Appearance Program) and followed all instructions given to him. His history of compliance shows he is willing and able to appear as required and obey supervision conditions.

In addition, he made substantial efforts to obtain lawful guidance and resolve his immigration situation responsibly. Unfortunately, while seeking legal assistance, he was defrauded by an organization that falsely claimed to provide legitimate legal representation. He paid a significant amount of money, believing they were qualified attorneys and relying on their false promises that he would "receive his green card soon." This fraud harmed his ability to secure legitimate counsel and meaningfully navigate his case, despite his clear intent to comply with the law.

3. Fraudulent Misrepresentations That Prejudiced His Ability to Seek Relief

The fraudulent organization went beyond charging money—they actively deceived Mr. Valladolid Cubillas and our family with fabricated claims and staged communications designed to make him believe his case was progressing successfully. They even made him

believe he participated in a video call with an immigration judge and that he had won his asylum case, which was false. These misrepresentations caused severe confusion, emotional distress, and significant prejudice to his ability to properly seek real legal help and prepare his case.

To support these statements, I am attaching affidavits, proof of the Zelle payments made to this fraudulent organization, and copies of the fake documentation the association sent to us.

4. Procedural History and Ongoing Detention Without Timely Review

When Mr. Valladolid Cubillas attended his first court hearing, he received a removal (deportation) order. However, he filed his appeal on time and submitted all evidence available to him in support of his case. Despite these timely actions, he remains detained, and his case has not been reviewed or resolved within a reasonable timeframe. Prolonged detention while his appeal and evidence remain pending—without meaningful review—creates a serious fairness and due process concern.

5. Lack of Criminal History, Strong Community Ties, and Family Hardship

The Petitioner has no criminal history and has demonstrated consistent compliance with supervision requirements. He also has strong family ties in the United States, including a wife and a minor child who depend on him both financially and emotionally. His continued detention is causing significant hardship to his household, destabilizing the family's finances and negatively affecting the emotional well-being of his child. These circumstances further support that he is not a danger to the community and not a flight risk, and that continued detention is unnecessary.

6. Less Restrictive Alternatives Are Available

ICE has effective alternatives to detention, including electronic monitoring, regular check-ins, and orders of supervision. Mr. Valladolid Cubillas is fully willing to comply with any conditions ordered by this Honorable Court or required by ICE. These less restrictive measures can ensure his appearance and compliance without unnecessary confinement.

7. Barriers to Accessing the Legal System

Mr. Valladolid Cubillas faces serious barriers, including language limitations, restricted access to legal resources while detained, and emotional distress that impairs his ability to effectively advocate for himself. I am providing support so he can communicate clearly, present his documentation, and pursue relief through the proper legal process.

8. Respectful Request to the Court

In light of the facts described above, I respectfully request that this Honorable Court:

Order Mr. Valladolid Cubillas's immediate release from ICE custody; or, in the alternative,

Grant a prompt custody redetermination (bond) hearing before a neutral judge; and

Ensure he receives appropriate medical evaluation and treatment while his case remains pending, and that his claims and evidence receive timely review.

Thank you for your time and consideration, and for your continued commitment to protecting the constitutional rights of individuals held in civil detention.
