Summary of Concepcion Ramirez Lopez

Concepcion Ramirez Lopez ([REDACTED]), is a long-term Massachusetts resident with no criminal history

He has lived in the USA for over 20 years & qualifies for an EOIR-42 -application for cancellation removal.

He is a devoted father of three U.S. citizen children, and a valued member of New Ministry Church.

Mr. Ramirez has been detained for six months and has been moved across three states (MA, NY, TX).

Mr. Ramirez followed all procedures for bond hearings including submission of a habeas corpus to a Federal Court.

His case has strong humanitarian factors and eligibility under two federal class actions: Maldonado Bautista v. Santacruz and Guerrero Orellana v. Moniz. We are humbly pleading that the Court please review our request. We are praying that the Court will allow Mr. Ramirez to continue to attend his Immigration procedures in Massachusetts while providing for his family & continuing to contribute & serve others in our community.

Our general Pastor has asked us to travel to El Paso and to respectfully make the request to the Court. If our request is granted we can arrange for Mr. Ramirez to travel back to Massachusetts with us. We will ensure that he reports to the ICE/ERO Burlington Massachusetts Facility as well as attending all immigration hearings.

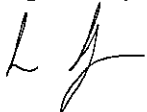

6. To the Court, on the subject of US Sponsors, my Church & fellow church members have provided all documentation to ensure my attendance at future immigration court hearings. (See Exhibit C & Exhibit H)
7. I humbly plea to the Court to consider my request, my prayer to the Court & to God is to please consider the mental & financial hardship of my children & wife.

Dear Judge, Schydlower:

We respectfully submit this request for case review in support of the Pro Se Motion to Supplement the Record filed by Mr. Concepcion Ramirez Lopez. We are his U.S.-citizen sponsors and representatives from New Ministry Church.

Mr. Ramirez is a long-standing member of our church and community. His continued detention has caused significant emotional and financial hardship to his wife and three U.S.-citizen children: [REDACTED] a college student struggling emotionally; [REDACTED] age 14, who has been deeply affected by his father's absence; and [REDACTED] age 6, who is confused and heartbroken.

Mr. Ramirez has no criminal history and has fully cooperated with all immigration proceedings. He has strong community ties, a stable family, and a committed support network ready to assist him immediately upon release.

We also respectfully advise the Court that ICE/ERO has served Mr. Ramirez with class action notices confirming his eligibility to request conditional parole or a bond hearing, including notices from the Maldonado Bautista and Guerrero Orellana class actions.

Mr. Ramirez has now been detained for six months and has been moved between three detention centers across Massachusetts, New York, and Texas. Each move has placed additional stress on his family and his ability to communicate with supporters.

Our general Pastor has asked us to travel to El Paso and to respectfully make this request directly to the ICE/ERO staff. We are presently in El Paso for this purpose. If our request is granted, we can personally arrange for Mr. Ramirez to travel back to Massachusetts with us and ensure that he reports to the ICE/ERO Burlington, MA Facility and attends all scheduled immigration hearings.

Attached to this request are the documents referenced in Mr. Ramirez's Pro Se Motion, including ICE Form 60-001, class action notices, immigration and federal court status documents, character reference letters, family photos, and sponsor documentation.

We respectfully and prayerfully request that the Court review the record and consider granting release through conditional parole or by ordering an immigration bond hearing so that Mr. Ramirez may reunite with his family while continuing to attend all immigration proceedings.

CLASS ACTION NOTICE

You may be a member of a class that has been certified by the United States District Court for the Central District of California in *Lazaro Maldonado Bautista et al. v. Ernesto Santacruz Jr et al.*, No. 5:25-cv-01873-SSS-BFM (C.D. Cal. 2025). On December 18, 2025, the District Court issued a ruling that certain immigration detainees may be unlawfully detained and may seek release on bond or conditional parole under 8 U.S.C. § 1226(a). Therefore, you may be entitled to request release on bond or conditional parole by immigration officers; you may also be entitled to a bond hearing upon your request to the Immigration Court. At the bond hearing, the Immigration Judge may determine that you are eligible to be released on bond while your removal proceedings are pending.

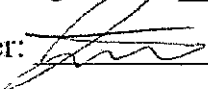

RESPONDENT'S MOTION FOR CUSTODY REDETERMINATION

AT A BOND HEARING

Respondent Concepcion Ramirez Lopez respectfully moves the Court to hold a custody redetermination and bond hearing in his case. As grounds for this motion, Respondent states as follows:

1. Respondent Concepcion Ramirez Lopez ("Juan") is a 39-year-old male Guatemalan citizen (D.O.B. ) who entered the United States ("US") on or about 2003, was not placed in removal proceedings, but was apprehended by Immigration and Customs Enforcement ("ICE") around September 10, 2025, when he was leaving his home in Dorchester, Massachusetts. Since then, Respondent has been moved from the Burlington Field Office in Massachusetts to a detention facility in Buffalo, New York, where he has no family or friends;
2. The Respondent has never been physically removed from the United States, is not subject to mandatory detention provisions, and is currently being held by ICE at the Buffalo Federal Detention Facility;

3. In Massachusetts, in bond proceedings, the Department of Homeland Security (“DHS”) has the burden of proving that the noncitizen is a danger to the community by clear and convincing evidence or a flight risk by a preponderance of the evidence. See Brito v. Garland, 22 F.4th 240 (1st Cir. 2021). In other jurisdictions, this standard might be different;
4. Counsel respectfully requests a prompt Bond Hearing date to minimize the Respondent’s time in detention. Counsel is a solo practitioner and would appreciate it if the Immigration Judge’s Sir or Madam Clerk would contact him to schedule this case for a hearing without delay and avoid potential conflicts;
5. This party will file a package of documents in support of bond without delay as soon as the bond hearing is scheduled.
6. This Court has jurisdiction to consider this motion pursuant to 8 C.F.R. § 1003.19 (providing that applications for a bond redetermination may be made to the “Immigration Court having jurisdiction over the place of detention”).
