**Re: Student Attorney Registration with PACER/ECF
*Aguirre Solis v. Noem, 2:26-cv-00053-APG-EJY***

Dear Chief Judge Gordon,

This letter responds to the clerk's notices, ECF No. 5 and ECF No. 6. The clerk noted non-compliance with the Court's rules requiring attorneys to be registered with the Court's electronic filing system (Local Rule IC 2-1), specifically with regard to the two law student attorneys who practice under my supervision, Mr. Raymond Wu and Ms. Tia Zghaib. *See* ECF No. 1 at 35 (statement regarding law student appearance).

I write to seek the Court's guidance regarding how student attorneys should properly register with PACER. Student attorneys practicing under Local Rule IA 11-5 are by definition not licensed attorneys. As a result, attorney registration with the PACER system does not appear available to them. PACER offers a student registration, but it appears designed for research purposes only. Other non-attorney registration categories also seem to be a poor fit for the role of a law student under IA 11-5. For these reasons, we request the Court's guidance as to how law student attorneys should register with PACER.

As an alternative solution, I would request that the Court waive PACER registration requirements for Mr. Wu and Ms. Zghaib. We would also waive any requirement for the Court or Respondents to separately serve Mr. Wu and Ms. Zghaib. As the supervising attorney, I understand that I am responsible for all of our representations and legal work as set out in IA 11-5. All court filings will be through my ECF/PACER account or by another fully licensed attorney. There is no need for the Court or for Respondents to separately serve Mr. Wu and Ms. Zghaib since I am serving as lead counsel.
