**DECLARATION OF  
DEPORTATION OFFICER  
ANGELA MINNER**

Angela Minner, Deportation Officer, United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), Department of Homeland Security (DHS), for her declaration under 28 U.S.C. § 1746 hereby states as follows:

1. The following declaration is based on a review of contents of the Plaintiff's alien file, official records checks, and information relayed to me by other officials.
2. I am and have been employed with DHS and the Department of Justice (DOJ) since October 20, 2002. I began my career as an Immigration Inspector with the former Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS). The position and agency were later renamed to CBP Officer with Customs and Border Protection (CBP). Since November of 2009, I have served as a Deportation Officer (DO) with Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO).

3. As a Deportation Officer, my duties include: (1) arresting illegal aliens who are removable from the United States; (2) processing illegal aliens who will be removed from the United States or placed into removal proceedings before an immigration judge; (3) monitoring illegal aliens' cases until removal; (4) handling matters related to the detention and release of aliens in ICE custody; (5) requesting travel documents and coordinating travel for illegal aliens ordered removed from the United States; and (6) presenting cases to the United States Attorney's Office for possible criminal prosecution. My duties may, at times, include other responsibilities related to the apprehension, arrest, and removal of illegal aliens, as needed.

4. Oscar FLORES A.K.A. Oscar NINO-FLORES (Hereinafter referred to as "FLORES") is a citizen and national of Mexico. FLORES first entered the United States on or about July 20, 2005 at an unknown place. U.S. Border Patrol (USBP) encountered FLORES near Concepcion, Texas and processed him by voluntary return to Mexico.

5. On an unknown date at an unknown place, FLORES re-entered the U.S. without inspection. ICE/ERO in Dallas, TX encountered FLORES at the Dallas County Jail (DCJ) on April 10, 2010 pursuant to FLORES' arrest for DWI. ICE/ERO lodged a detainer with the DCJ and arrested FLORES on May 4, 2010 upon his release from the DCJ and processed him by voluntary return to Mexico.

6. On or about April 15, 2014, FLORES re-entered the U.S. without inspection. USBP encountered FLORES near Laredo, TX and processed him by Expedited Removal.

7. On April 16, 2014, the U.S. District Court in the Southern District of Texas, Laredo Division, convicted FLORES of 8 USC 1325, Illegal Entry and sentenced him to 30 days.

Attached as **Exhibit A** to this declaration is a true and correct copy of Judgment dated April 16, 2014, Record of plea of guilty to the offense of entering the United States illegally, in violation of 8 U.S.C. §1325(a)(1).

8. On May 14, 2014, FLORES was formally removed to Mexico under Expedited Removal.

9. On an unknown date at an unknown place, FLORES re-entered the U.S. without inspection.

10. On January 10, 2026, ICE/ERO, while conducting at-large enforcement activities, encountered FLORES and determined that he did not have legal authorization to remain in the U. S. ICE/ERO arrested FLORES for removal proceedings.

11. On January 11, 2026, due to a detention bed space shortage, ICE/ERO transferred FLORES to El Paso Camp East Montana facility in El Paso, TX. FLORES was moved before ICE learned of the petition. FLORES is being processed for removal proceedings under Section 1229a.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States of America that the foregoing is true and correct.
