Claim THREE: I have been waiting for more than 180 days after the judge order from deportation to my country of d'origine.

supporting (A): I do not have information in regards to why I am still in detention beyond the lawful time period after a judge decision 90 days. If the judge decision has power, then my detention is lawful.

Claim Four: My preexistin physical and mental health is deteriorating due to condition of detention facility and inadequate medical care.

supporting (A): I have been detained since June 2014. The lack of contact with my family worsened my physical and mental health. I was transferred to another prison and have been held in a cell measuring 4 meters by 2 meters for the past 20 days.

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**ENCOUNTER:**

Border Patrol Agent (BPA) JONES, PHILIP encountered CHARA, HASSAN (DOB: 11/11/2002) a citizen of SUDAN), on 06/23/2024 at approximately 2347 in an area near the LUKEVILLE Port of Entry in Arizona. The Border Patrol Agent then determined CHARA, HASSAN had unlawfully entered the United States of America near LUKEVILLE, AZ from SUDAN at a time and place other than as designated by the Secretary of Homeland Security of the United States of America. CHARA, HASSAN was apprehended within a group of 18 individual.

After determining that CHARA, HASSAN was an alien whom illegally entered the United States of America, CHARA, HASSAN was arrested and transported to the Tucson Soft-Sided Facility for further processing using the e3/IDENT and IAFIS Systems.

**IMMIGRATION VIOLATION:**

At the Tucson Soft-Sided Facility, CHARA, HASSAN stated that he was a citizen and national of SUDAN without the necessary legal documents to enter, pass through, or remain in the United States. CHARA, HASSAN also admitted to illegally crossing the international boundary on 06/23/2024 at approximately 2100 near LUKEVILLE, AZ without being inspected by an immigration officer at a designated Port of Entry.

**CONSULAR NOTIFICATION:**

CHARA, HASSAN was notified of his right to communicate with a Consular Officer from his country as per Article 36(1)(b) of the Vienna convention on Consular Relations. CHARA, HASSAN indicated that he understood this right but declined to speak with anyone at this time. CHARA, HASSAN, exhibited NO manifestation of fear and expressed no intention to apply for asylum or related protection while in Border Patrol custody.

**DISPOSITION/ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

CHARA, HASSAN is being held in Service custody pending removal proceedings as an Expedited Removal as per Section 235(b)(1)(A)(iii) of the INA. CHARA, HASSAN was apprehended within fourteen days of their last entry into the United States and within 100 air miles from the United States/SUDAN international boundary.


As per Presidential Proclamation, Securing the Border, pursuant to the Interim Final Rule, Securing the Border, 8 C.F.R. \_ 235.15, guidelines CHARA, HASSAN was not issued an I-867A/B Sworn Statement. CHARA, HASSAN will be removed at a time, place and in a manner consistent with removal proceedings for a citizen of their respective nation.

But there is no indication that the government officials disbelieved his claim that he's not affiliated with the resistance, and there's simply just not enough for this court to find that the government of Sudan would seek respondent out for torture when truly he had very limited role in a community effort to distribute charitable supplies. And as explained above, the court would find that respondent appears to be able to relocate. For the reasons explained above, the court finds it unlikely the government is going to be motivated to track down respondent in a different part of the Sudan. So based on the totality of the evidence and testimony provided, the court finds that respondent has simply failed to meet his burden of proof. Based on the foregoing, the court issues the following orders. It is hereby ordered that respondent's application for asylum be denied. It is hereby ordered that respondent's application for withholding of removal under Section 241(b)(3) is denied. It is hereby ordered that respondent's applications for withholding of removal and deferral of removal under the Convention Against Torture is denied. And it is further ordered that respondent be removed to Sudan.

AN APPLICATION FOR A WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS  
PURSUANT TO 28 U.S.C. § 2241**

Attached are the forms you will need to file an application for a writ of habeas corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2241. All questions must be answered clearly and concisely in the appropriate spaces on the forms. Attach an additional page if you need extra space to answer a question, clearly identifying the question to which the additional page pertains. Absent prior order of the Court, the total length of the application, including the form and all additional pages, may not exceed thirty pages. Pursuant to the Court's local rules, the application and all other papers must be typewritten or legibly handwritten, text shall be printed on only one side of each page, all documents must be filed on paper that measures 8.5 inches by 11 inches, and all papers shall include margins of 1.5 inches at the top and 1 inch at the left, right, and bottom.

You should exercise care to assure that all answers are true, correct, and complete. You are cautioned that any deliberately false statement of a material fact may serve as a basis for prosecution and conviction for perjury. You must sign each form. Further instructions for completing these forms are provided below.

**The Filing Fee and 28 U.S.C. § 1915**

1. Prisoners seeking leave to proceed under 28 U.S.C. § 1915 must comply with the following procedures. Section 1915(h) defines a "prisoner" as "any person incarcerated or detained in any facility who is accused of, convicted of, sentenced for, or adjudicated delinquent for, violations of criminal law or the terms and conditions of parole, probation, pretrial release, or diversionary program."

2. The application for a writ of habeas corpus must be accompanied by the full \$5.00 filing fee. If you want to commence an action without prepayment of fees or security therefor, you must file a motion and affidavit for leave to proceed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915. You also must submit a certificate of the warden or other appropriate officer of the institution in which you are confined as to the amount of money or securities currently on deposit in your inmate trust fund account (or institutional equivalent). The Court cannot consider the merits of the claims asserted in any habeas corpus application filed without either the \$5.00 filing fee or a properly completed motion, affidavit, and certificate as to the amount currently on deposit in your trust fund account (or institutional equivalent).

**The Habeas Corpus Application**

1. You must provide the Court with an original habeas corpus application. You should keep a copy of the application for your own records. The Court will not provide a copy for you.

2. This form may be used by applicants challenging the execution of a state or federal sentence, the revocation or denial of parole, or the loss of good- or earned-time credits. The form also may be used by pretrial detainees raising speedy trial or extradition issues or by aliens

challenging Immigration and Naturalization Service proceedings. This is not a complete list and you may use this form to raise any other claims for relief you may have that are appropriate in a 28 U.S.C. § 2241 action. This form may not be used to assert claims challenging the conditions of your confinement, such as medical treatment claims.

3. When your habeas corpus application is completed, it should be mailed with the filing fee or motion for leave to proceed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915 to the Clerk of the United States District Court at the following address:

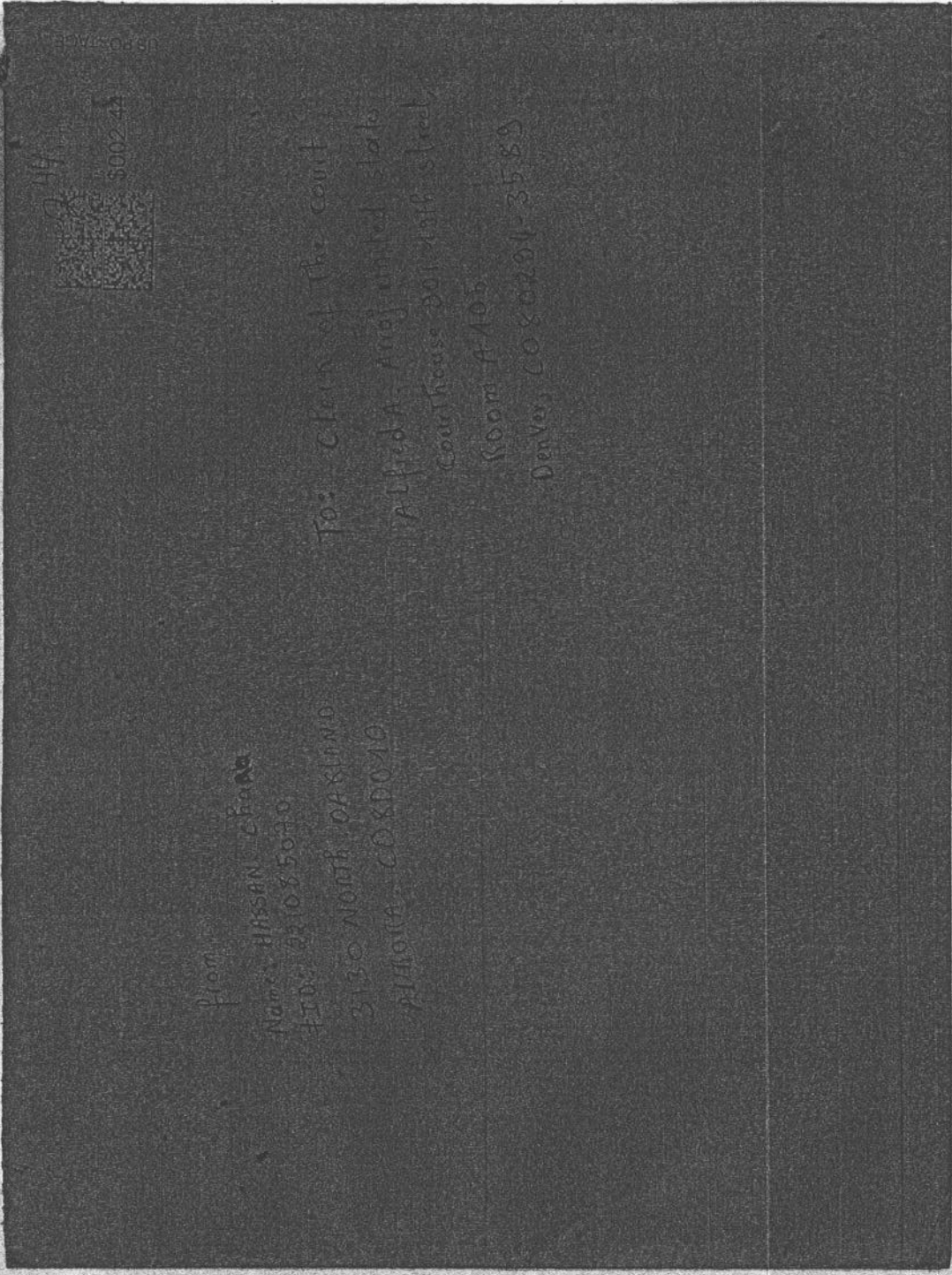
