RESPONSE TO PETITION

16 On July 8, 2025, the Department of Homeland Security (“DHS”) instituted a
17 notice titled “Interim Guidance Regarding Detention Authority for Applicants for
18 Admission” (the “Notice”) requiring, in general, that anyone arrested in the United States
19 and charged with being inadmissible to be considered an “applicant for admission” under
20 8 U.S.C. § 1225(b)(2)(A), subject to mandatory detention under 8 U.S.C. §
21 1225(b)(2)(A) and not subject to detention under 8 U.S.C. § 1226(a).

22 In *Maldonado Bautista v. Santacruz*, No. 5:25-CV-01873-SSS-BFM, --- F. Supp.
23 3d ---, 2025 WL 3289861 (C.D. Cal. Nov. 20, 2025), the district court declared the
24 Notice unlawful under the Administrative Procedure Act but did not issue a final
25 judgment. On December 18, 2025, however, the *Bautista* court entered final judgement.
26 *Bautista*, ECF No. 94. Accordingly, Respondents acknowledge that Petitioner is
27 detained under 8 U.S.C. § 1226(a) and is entitled to an order from this Court directing a
28

1 bond hearing be held pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1226(a).¹

2 Respondents reserve the right to supplement this response in the event of a stay of
3 enforcement of the *Bautista* final judgment, appellate relief, or a change in DHS policy.
