

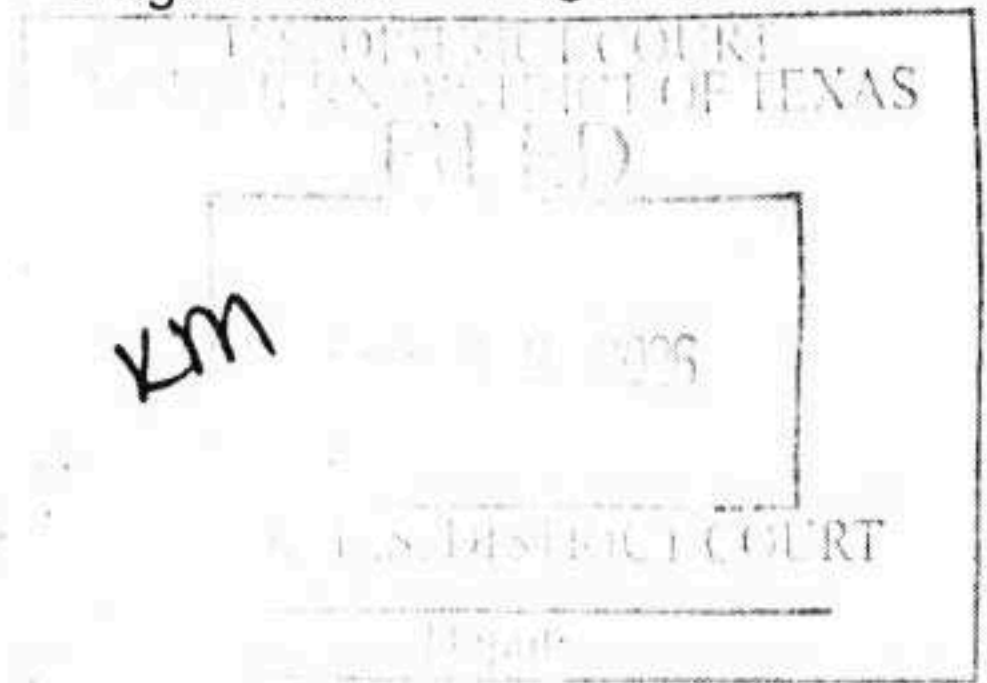

**MOTION TO ADD ADDITIONAL SERVICE ADDRESS
TO PREVENT PREJUDICE FROM DETENTION MAIL DELAYS**

I. BACKGROUND

Petitioner is currently detained at Prairieland Detention Center in Alvarado, Texas. As a civil immigration detainee, Petitioner has no control over incoming legal mail distribution. Legal correspondence frequently experiences delay after arrival due to institutional processing procedures. This case involves constitutional claims and strict deadlines. Any delay in receiving Court notices may impair Petitioner's ability to comply with deadlines and protect her procedural rights.

II. LEGAL BASIS

Federal courts possess inherent authority to manage their dockets and ensure fairness in proceedings. See *Landis v. North American Co.*, 299 U.S. 248, 254 (1936). Courts routinely permit additional service addresses where necessary to prevent prejudice to detained litigants. The requested relief does not alter Petitioner's pro se status or expand service obligations; it ensures timely notice and protects due process rights.

III. REQUEST FOR RELIEF

Petitioner respectfully requests that the Court direct the Clerk to continue sending official correspondence to Prairieland Detention Center and additionally send courtesy copies to:
