Petitioner was most recently detained by Respondents on January 10, 2026, and Respondents are *still* waiting to determine a third country of removal. *See* ECF Doc. 7. This comes after 110 days of detention. Respondents have no anticipated timeline for when they will receive travel documents. Respondents claim they presented Petitioner with Mexico as an option for removal; however, they present no record of that this was a choice or that they provided any opportunity for Petitioner to claim fear he may have of removal to Mexico.

The present 110 days of detention is in addition to the 140 days Petitioner spent in detention from his final order of removal on September 7, 2006, to January 25, 2007. *See* ECF Doc. 4-1, at ¶¶ 10-11. Cumulatively, Petitioner has spent at least 250 days in Respondents' custody by their own admissions. While Petitioner still maintains that the *Zadvydas* six-month presumptively reasonable period tolls

whether or not Petitioner is detained, he has long exceeded this reasonable period based on days behind bars as well. Immediate release is warranted.
