**I. JURISDICTION**

This petition is submitted pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2241. This Court has jurisdiction because the Petitioner is currently in ICE custody within the Northern District of Texas, without timely access to an immigration judge and without a clear explanation of the legal basis for her detention.

**II. IDENTITY OF THE PETITIONER**

**III. FACTS OF THE CASE**

The Petitioner has a pending asylum case that was properly filed and received by the Immigration Court. She has consistently complied with all ICE reporting requirements. She attended her first immigration court hearing in March 2025, and her next hearing is scheduled for January 2028.

The Petitioner expressly seeks to continue and conclude her immigration proceedings while at liberty, in order to adequately gather and organize all evidence in support of her asylum claim, as well as to secure the necessary financial resources to retain the legal services of an immigration attorney to represent her in such proceedings.

The Petitioner does not pose a flight risk, as she has consistently complied with all immigration obligations, has appeared timely for all ICE check-ins, maintains a known and stable residence, has a pending asylum case before the Immigration Court with an assigned judge and scheduled future hearings, and has demonstrated a clear intent to pursue her legal process in accordance with the law.

On February 4, 2026, the Petitioner appeared for her routine ICE check-in appointment, scheduled between 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m., and during that appointment she was detained without a judicial order or clear explanation.

At approximately 11:50 a.m., the Petitioner was permitted to make her first phone call, lasting approximately five minutes. At approximately 12:40 p.m., she was permitted a second phone call, lasting approximately seven minutes, during which she reported being held in an extremely small room with approximately twenty-three other women under overcrowded conditions.

During one of these calls, the Petitioner reported that other detained women informed her that they had been held for several days under the same overcrowded, cold, and inadequate conditions.

At approximately 8:27 p.m., the Petitioner reported that she had received only two chicken nuggets and a small bag of chips as food for the entire day.

At approximately 9:45 p.m., the Petitioner made her final phone call, reporting that only four women had been transferred to a detention facility and that the remaining detainees were informed that transportation buses were not operational, requiring them to remain overnight at the ICE facility, sleeping on the floor with plastic sheets, in cold conditions and without adequate space.

Since that final phone call, there has been no further communication with the Petitioner. As of February 5, 2026, the Petitioner no longer appeared in the ICE detainee locator system, and upon contacting the detention facility, it was reported that she was not listed at that location, without any additional information regarding her whereabouts.

#### **IV. IMMIGRATION HISTORY AND COMPLIANCE**

The Petitioner has no criminal history and has complied with all immigration requirements, including biometric appointments, court appearances, and ICE reporting. She was previously released under Form I-220A and fully complied with all conditions of release. She currently holds valid employment authorization.

#### **V. LEGAL VIOLATIONS**

The Petitioner's continued detention without access to an immigration judge, notice of charges, or transparency regarding her location constitutes a violation of her Fifth Amendment due process rights.

#### **VI. RELIEF REQUESTED**

The Petitioner respectfully requests that this Court order ICE to immediately disclose the Petitioner's location and the legal basis for her detention; order her immediate release; or, in the alternative, order a prompt bond hearing before an immigration judge.

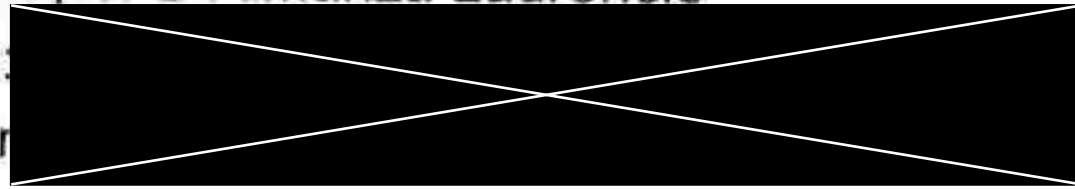

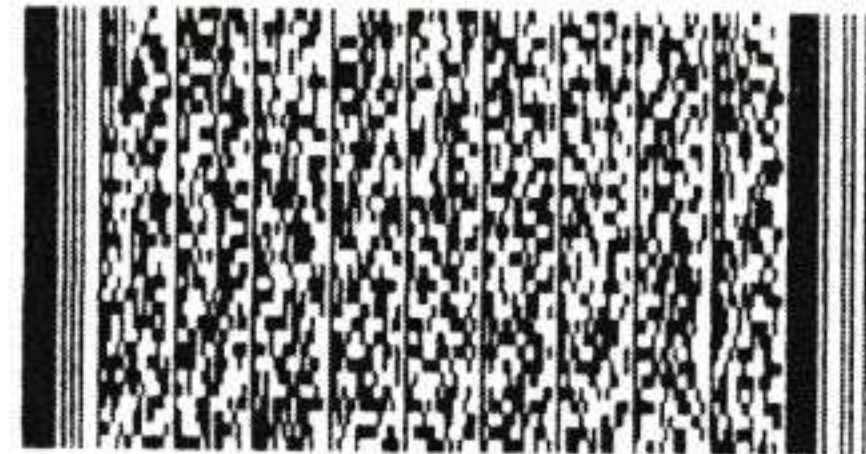

This letter refers to your Form I-589, Application for Asylum and for Withholding of Removal.

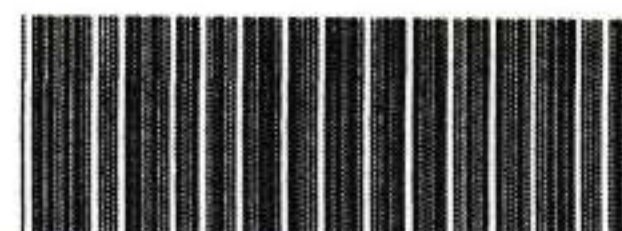
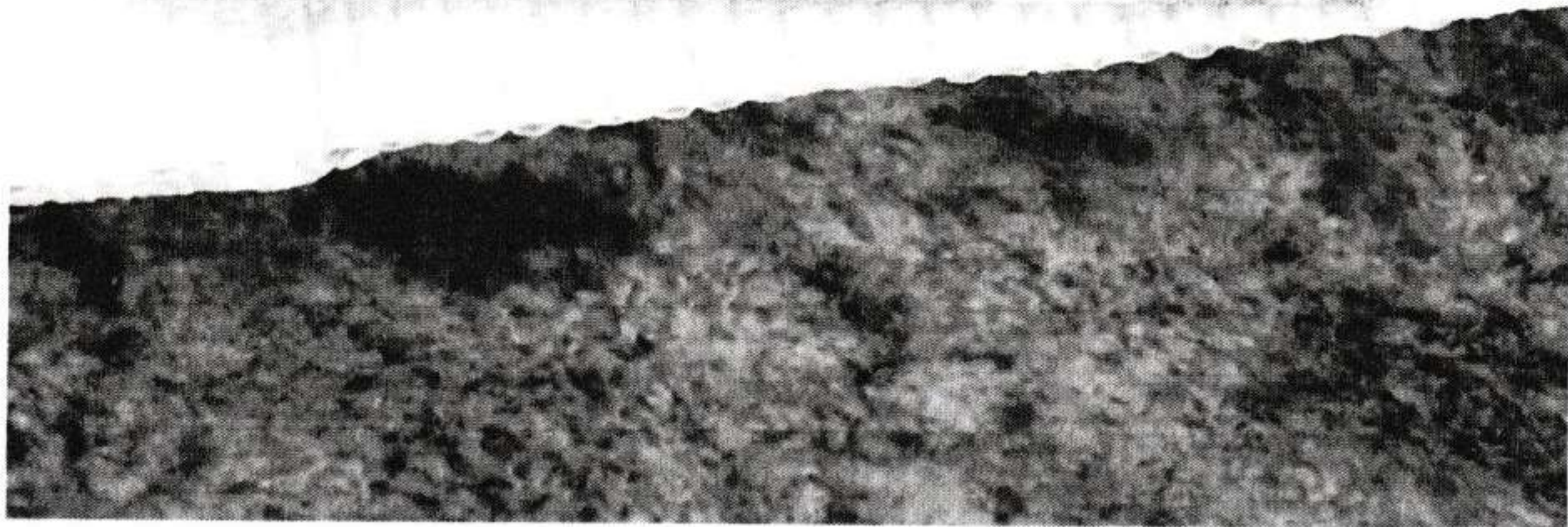
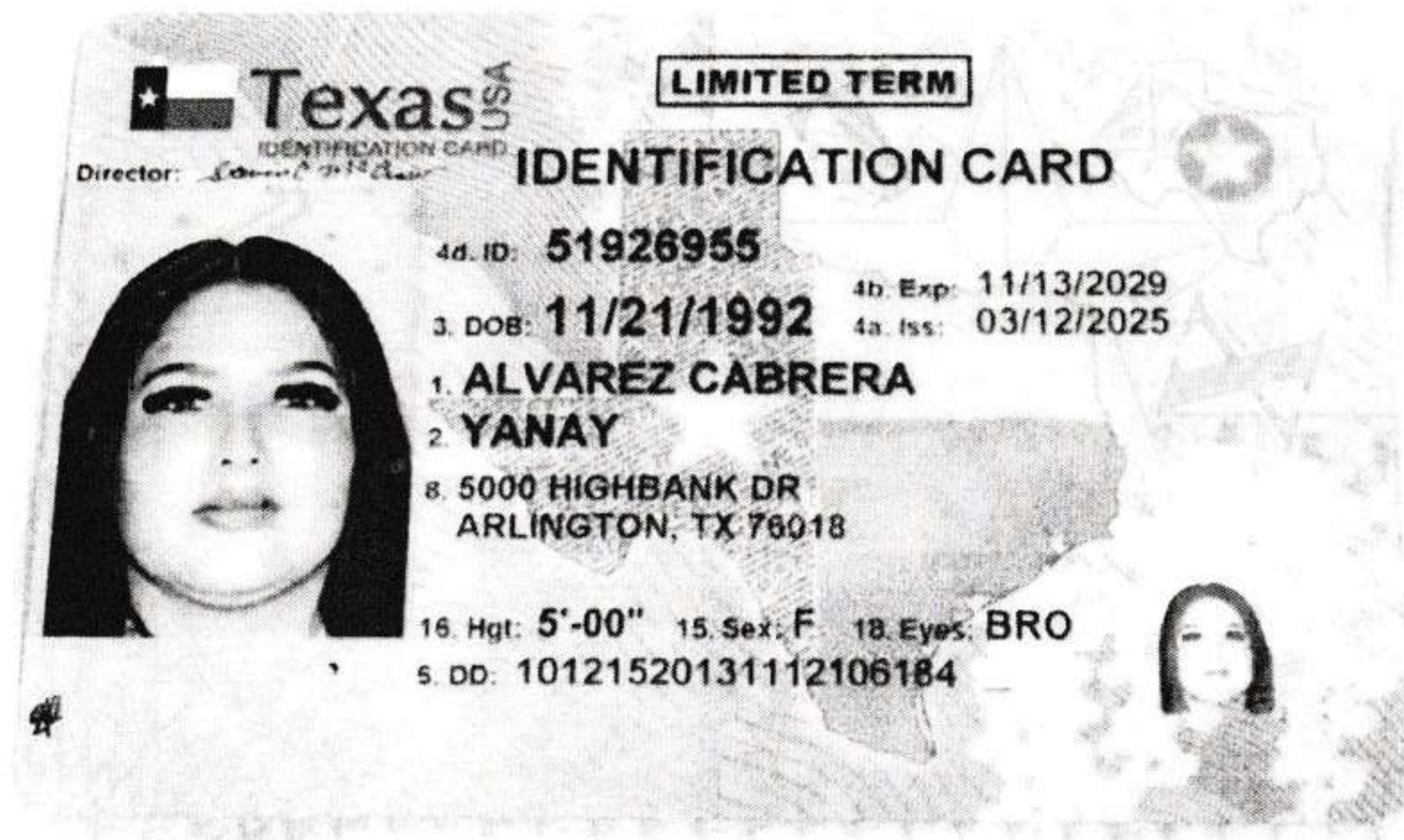
