I. JURISDICTION

1. This Honorable Court has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2241, as the Petitioner is in federal custody within the jurisdiction of this Court.

2. The Petitioner is currently detained at Prairieland Detention Center, located in Alvarado, Texas, under the custody of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE).

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II. THE PARTIES

3. The Petitioner, Johan Carlos Páez Calderón, is a citizen of Venezuela and is identified by alien number A# 246-410-561.

4. The Respondent is the Warden of Prairieland Detention Center, who exercises immediate custody over the Petitioner.

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III. REPRESENTATION AS "NEXT FRIEND"

5. This Petition is filed by Leymary Josefina Mejias Montero, the Petitioner's legal wife, acting as "Next Friend," because the Petitioner is detained and does not have full, free, and effective access to this Honorable Court.

6. The Next Friend maintains a significant and direct relationship with the Petitioner, being his legal wife and the mother of his four children, one (1) of whom is a United States citizen by birth.

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#### IV. RELEVANT FACTS

7. The Petitioner entered the United States legally and has consistently complied with all requirements and obligations imposed by immigration authorities.

8. The Petitioner has a pending asylum application, approved Temporary Protected Status (TPS), and a valid I-94 document, demonstrating that his presence in the country was known, monitored, and authorized by the United States government.

9. The Petitioner has no criminal record whatsoever, poses no danger to the community, and is not a flight risk.

10. On January 28, 2026, the Petitioner voluntarily attended his check-in appointment with ICE, as he had consistently done since entering the United States, complying at all times with the instructions received.

11. Despite his full compliance and exemplary conduct, the Petitioner was immediately detained during this appointment and placed in ICE custody without the possibility of bond.

12. Since that date, the Petitioner has remained detained at Prairieland Detention Center, without being granted an individualized bond hearing or provided with an adequate justification for his continued detention.

13. The Petitioner's detention constitutes a prolonged, arbitrary, and unjustified detention, especially considering that he had valid immigration protections at the time of his detention.

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#### V. IRREPARABLE HARM

14. The Petitioner's detention has caused severe, continuous, and irreparable harm to his family.

15. The Petitioner is the father of four minor children, one (1) of whom is a United States citizen, all of whom depend on him emotionally and financially.

16. The Petitioner's forced separation has generated serious emotional, psychological, and economic consequences for his wife and children, directly impacting the stability and well-being of the household.

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#### VI. LEGAL GROUNDS

17. The Petitioner's continued detention violates the right to Due Process guaranteed by the Fifth Amendment of the United States Constitution.

18. The government has not demonstrated that the Petitioner's detention is necessary to ensure public safety or to prevent a risk of flight.

19. Detention without an individualized bond hearing constitutes a violation of the principles of reasonableness and proportionality required by federal law.

20. The use of detention as punishment for complying with mandatory immigration appointments is contrary to the Constitution and fundamental principles of justice.

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#### VII. REQUEST FOR RELIEF

For the reasons stated above, the Petitioner respectfully requests that this Honorable Court:

- a. Declare that the Petitioner's detention is unconstitutional and unlawful;
- b. Order the immediate release of the Petitioner;
- c. In the alternative, order an immediate and individualized bond hearing; and
- d. Grant any other relief that the Court deems just and appropriate.

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#### VIII. DECLARATION UNDER PENALTY OF PERJURY

I declare under penalty of perjury, under the laws of the United States, that the foregoing is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief.

1. I am the legal wife of Johan Carlos Páez Calderón, Alien Number A# 246-410-561, who is currently detained at the Prairieland Detention Center in Alvarado, Texas, under the custody of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE).
2. My husband was detained on January 28, 2026, after voluntarily appearing at his ICE check-in appointment, in full compliance with all instructions and requirements imposed by immigration authorities.
3. My husband has no criminal record whatsoever, does not pose a danger to the community, and does not represent a risk of flight. He has consistently complied with all immigration obligations and requirements.
4. My husband is the father of four (4) children, all residing in the United States, one (1) of whom is a United States citizen by birth. Our children depend on their father emotionally, financially, and for family stability.
5. My husband's continued detention has caused severe, ongoing, and irreparable harm to our family, affecting us emotionally, psychologically, and economically, and directly impacting the well-being, stability, and development of our children.
6. Because my husband is currently detained and does not have full, meaningful, or effective access to this Honorable Court, I submit the Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus on his behalf, acting as his Next Friend, in order to seek judicial review of the legality and constitutionality of his detention.

AFFIDAVIT OF JOHAN CARLOS PÁEZ CALDERÓN

I, Johan Carlos Páez Calderón, hereby declare under penalty of perjury, pursuant to the laws of the United States, as follows:

1. I am a citizen of Venezuela and am currently detained at the Prairieland Detention Center in Alvarado, Texas, under the custody of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE). My Alien Number is A# 246-410-561.

2. I entered the United States lawfully and, since my entry, I have consistently complied with all requirements and obligations imposed by immigration authorities, including appearing at all scheduled check-in appointments.

3. On January 28, 2026, I voluntarily appeared at my ICE check-in appointment, as I had consistently done since my entry into the United States, fully complying with all instructions provided to me.

4. Despite my full compliance and lack of any violations, I was immediately detained during this appointment and placed into ICE custody without the opportunity for bond.

5. As of the date of this affidavit, no final decision has been issued regarding my pending asylum application or my overall immigration case.

6. I have no criminal record whatsoever, do not pose a danger to the community, and am not a flight risk. I have always demonstrated my willingness to comply with the immigration process.

7. Prior to my detention, I resided in the United States with my wife and children, maintaining a stable family life and fulfilling my responsibilities as a husband and father.

8. I am the father of four (4) children, all residing in the United States, one (1) of whom is a United States citizen by birth. My children depend on me emotionally and financially, and my detention has caused them significant hardship.

9. My continued detention has caused severe emotional distress, anxiety, and psychological harm to both myself and my family, as well as serious financial hardship, due to my inability to provide for my household while detained.

10. I respectfully request that this Honorable Court review the legality and constitutionality of my detention and allow me to continue my immigration proceedings while released, so that I may reunite with my family and comply with all conditions imposed by the Court.

1. I am currently in the custody of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) while my immigration proceedings, including my pending asylum application, remain unresolved before the United States Immigration Court.
2. As of the date of this authorization, no final decision has been issued regarding my asylum claim or my overall immigration case.
3. I affirm that I have no criminal history whatsoever, do not pose a danger to the community, and do not represent a risk of flight.
4. By means of this document, I expressly, voluntarily, and knowingly authorize my wife, Leymary Josefina Mejías Montero, to act on my behalf as my "Next Friend," and to prepare, sign, and file a Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus (28 U.S.C. § 2241) before a United States Federal Court, for the purpose of seeking judicial review of the legality and constitutionality of my current detention.
5. I grant this authorization due to my condition of detention, which substantially limits my ability to personally and freely access the federal courts and to pursue this relief on my own.





At the conclusion of your hearing, you have a right to appeal an adverse decision by the immigration judge. You will be advised by the immigration judge before whom you appear of any relief from removal for which you may appear eligible including the privilege of voluntary departure. You will be given a reasonable opportunity to make any such application to the immigration judge.

**One-Year Asylum Application Deadline:** If you believe you may be eligible for asylum, you must file a Form I-589, Application for Asylum and for Withholding of Removal. The Form I-589, Instructions, and information on where to file the Form can be found at [www.uscis.gov/i-589](http://www.uscis.gov/i-589).
