GROUND ONE: Violation of 8 U.S.C. 1231(a)(6)
and Zadvydas v. Davis

Petitioner has been detained by ICE for more than 180+ days Post-Order-Removal. Petitioner's final order of removal was on 11/25/13. Petitioner has been in ICE custody since 10/22/25. ICE has not produced travel documents. There is no evidence of acceptance by a receiving country. Removal has not been effectuated despite prolonged detention.

GROUND TWO: Violation of the Fifth amendment Due Process

after 180 Days.

To date, ICE has failed to produce valid travel documents, confirmed country acceptance, or a scheduled removal plan without such evidence.
