REPLY LETTER IN RESPONSE TO PETITION FOR WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS

To the honorable Judge Jordan Pratt,

The petitioner, **William Dominguez-Miranda** hereby submit a response to the U.S. Attorney General's response to petitioner's Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus.

On May 22, 2026 the I did not exit the pod for processing for the 3rd country removal to Mexico, due to the loss of security in Mexico. I have no ties in that country. I am a Cuban citizen not a citizen of Mexico. I was not provided with any legal documents for when I did arrive in Mexico nor any legal status in Mexico. The safety for a Cuban citizen in Mexico is not guaranteed due to people being deported to this country by DHS and ICE without any legal documents upon arrival to Tapachula and Villahermosa Mexico. I was offered x 5 to go to Mexico and refused each time based on the lack of safety in Mexico.

I am willing to go back to Cuba but such a country does not accept anyone that has fled the country before 2017. The U.S. reports that Cuba is not taking anyone as well.

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I was under supervision from April 18, 2003 until October 24, 2025. DHS revoked my order of supervision without any violations (see Exhibit 1), only to try and deport me back to Cuba. This is not possible or reasonable within the foreseeable future. I have suffered emotional hardship due to this prolonged and indefinite detention. This prolonged and indefinite detention violates due process under Zadvydas vs. Davis, 533 U.S. 678 (2001).

I have both strong family and community ties within the United States. Provided are letters from family, friends and community that speak on my good moral character, close family relationships and community relationships (Exhibits 2-7). Demonstrating the lack of danger to the community and the availability of support I will have upon release.

For reasons discussed above and in my petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus, I humbly ask the court to grant the Writ of Habeas Corpus.
