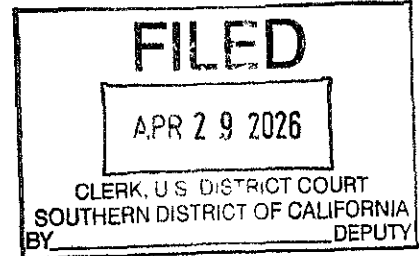

GROUND ONE: ILLEGAL AND UNLAWFUL MODE OF ARREST

I initially crossed the US border on 10/19/2022 and was released at the discretion of the attorney general on parole on 11/22/2023. I have ever since been living in the United States without violating the conditions of my set forward in my parole. ICE has not yet terminated my parole and there is no legal paper that terminates my parole. I was arrested when I went for my court hearing in Boston, Massachusetts, without ICE stating why I was arrested, I hereby assert that my arrest was unlawful, unconstitutional and illegal.

GROUND TWO: HABEAS CORPUS PETITION PROPERLY GRANTED BY A FEDERAL DISTRICT JUDGE - BOND HEARING NOT HELD ON NEUTRAL GROUNDS.

I was initially granted my petition of habeas corpus by a federal judge ordering respondents to grant me a bond hearing . During the course of this hearing the immigration did not consider the argument my lawyer put forward but instead gave merits only to the argument of DHS this was unjust and unfair. This immigration judge is known to deny petitioners bond order from a federal court deeming them a flight risk without considering the evidence put forward by the petitioner meeting his or her burden of proof to overcome the flight risk bar.

The conditions of residing in OTAY MESA DETENTION CENTER is unsanitary and unsafe, I am experiencing a severe decline in both my mental and physical health due to the inhumane conditions of living and the absence of vitamins, fresh fruit and other necessary nutrient needed to provide a healthy diet. This can be explained by the fact that this detention and its facilities were not designed to keep detainees for a long period of time. This violate the eight amendment as long as the conditions are inhumane or violates constitutional standards such as eight amendment prohibition on cruel and unusual punishment.
