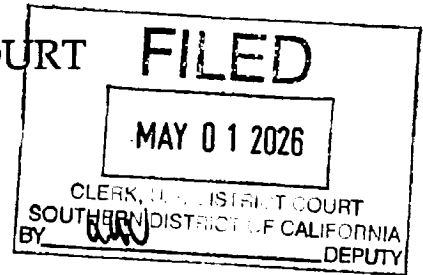

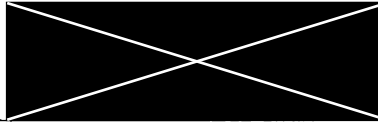

PETITION FOR A WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS UNDER 28 U.S.C. § 2241

Instructions

1. **Who Should Use This Form.** You should use this form if
 - you are a federal prisoner and you wish to challenge the way your sentence is being carried out (*for example, you claim that the Bureau of Prisons miscalculated your sentence or failed to properly award good time credits*);
 - you are in federal or state custody because of something other than a judgment of conviction (*for example, you are in pretrial detention or are awaiting extradition*); or
 - you are alleging that you are illegally detained in immigration custody.
2. **Who Should Not Use This Form.** You should not use this form if
 - you are challenging the validity of a federal judgment of conviction and sentence (*these challenges are generally raised in a motion under 28 U.S.C. § 2255*);
 - you are challenging the validity of a state judgment of conviction and sentence (*these challenges are generally raised in a petition under 28 U.S.C. § 2254*); or
 - you are challenging a final order of removal in an immigration case (*these challenges are generally raised in a petition for review directly with a United States Court of Appeals*).

3. **Preparing the Petition.** The petition must be typed or neatly written, and you must sign and date it under penalty of perjury. You must tell the truth and sign the form. **A false statement may lead to prosecution.** No notary is required. Petitions which do not conform to these instructions may be returned.

All questions must be answered clearly and concisely in the space on the form. Additional pages are not permitted except with respect to the facts which you rely upon to support your grounds for relief. **You do not need to cite law.** If you want to submit arguments, you must file a separate memorandum. All filings must be submitted on paper sized 8½ by 11 inches. **Do not use the back of any page.**

4. **Supporting Documents.** In addition to your petition, you must send to the court a copy of the decisions you are challenging and a copy of any briefs or administrative remedy forms filed in your case.
5. **Required Filing Fee.** You must pay a filing fee of \$5. If the fee is paid, your petition will be filed. If you cannot pay the fee, you may ask to proceed *in forma pauperis* (as a poor person). To do that, you must submit a written motion (a form is available from the Clerk's Office). Also you must submit a certificate signed by an officer at the institution where you are confined showing the amount of money the institution is holding for you.
6. **Submitting Documents to the Court:** When you have completed the form, send the original and one copy (for your records), along with the \$5 filing fee (or your motion to proceed *in forma pauperis*), to the Clerk of Court at either address (or submit to prison library staff if you are at an institution that participates in the electronic filing program):

7. **Change of Address.** You must notify the Court in writing of your new address within 7 days after a transfer or other change in address occurs. Failure to do so may result in dismissal of your case.
